

ESL Programming at the City of Toronto Archives

Bring your ESL class to the City of Toronto Archives, learn about the history of Toronto and its people, and help your students put into practice their listening and conversational skills!

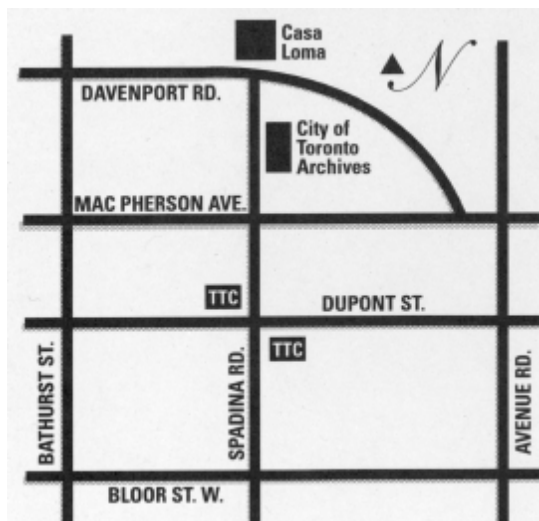
During their visit, students will:

- ☞ see and talk about maps and photographs showing what the city looked like one hundred years ago
- ☞ view and discuss photographs of immigrants to Toronto from a century ago
- ☞ discover, debate and compare the living and working conditions of the rich and poor in Toronto

Students will also have the option of watching a twenty-minute film about the development of Toronto since the 1920s, seeing a small selection of our records and documents, and visiting our viewing gallery where they can see the near twenty-five miles of records the Archives holds.

The program is free and lasts 1-1½ hours. Tours are conducted by Archives staff, who are experienced in conversing with English language learners of all levels. The program can be adjusted to meet your class's schedule or special needs.

For students with children, a separate room can be booked where the children and their caregivers can stay while the class tours the building (maximum capacity of eighteen). Advance booking is required. To book a visit or for more information, please contact:
