

Multi-Use Pathway Construction Conlins Road to Meadowvale Road

Expected Project Start: December 2010
Expected Project Completion Date: March 31, 2011

Project Overview

The City of Toronto will begin construction of a multi-use trail along the Gatineau Hydro Corridor, which runs east of Conlins Road. This pathway will be used for both commuting and recreation. The width of the path will be 3.5 metres.

The new off-road asphalt pathway will be approximately 1.8 kilometres long, from Conlins Road to Meadowvale Road, through the Gatineau Hydro Corridor.

Construction Details

Work will include a new asphalt pathway which will connect to an existing pathway at Meadowvale Road. New construction to create the pathway will include excavation, placement of gravel base material, and asphalt paving.

The signalized intersection at Dean Park Road and Sheppard Avenue East will be retro-fitted to allow people using the pathway to cross the streets safely. Some shrubs and trees will be trimmed to accommodate the new pathway alignment.

Dust will be controlled during construction. A full-time site inspector will also be on-site.

The segment(s) of pathway under construction will be closed to the public during construction. No impacts to other utilities are expected. Ashland Paving Ltd. was awarded this contract. Construction will start in December 2010 and is expected to be completed by March 31, 2011.

Work Hours

Construction shall be carried out between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on weekdays and between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on weekends and statutory holidays in accordance with City By-laws.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access

Access to private driveways, sidewalks, pathways, TTC/GO transit shelters/bus stops, etc will not be impacted.

Traffic lane restrictions will be required for improvements at the intersection of Dean Park Road and Sheppard Avenue East. Lane closures will be accompanied by on-site signage

The construction staging areas (storage, equipment etc) will be located along the multi-use pathway on the west side of Dean Park Road.
