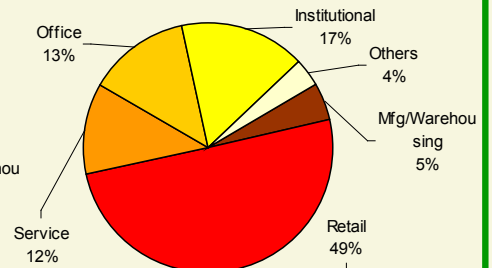

Total Employment by Sector

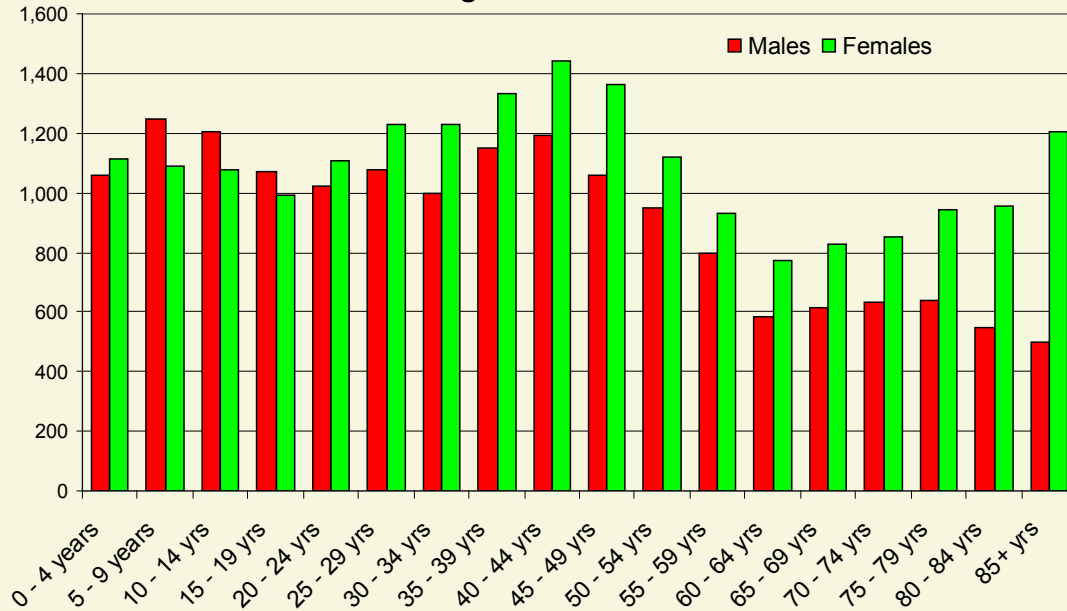


Part-Time Employment by Sector

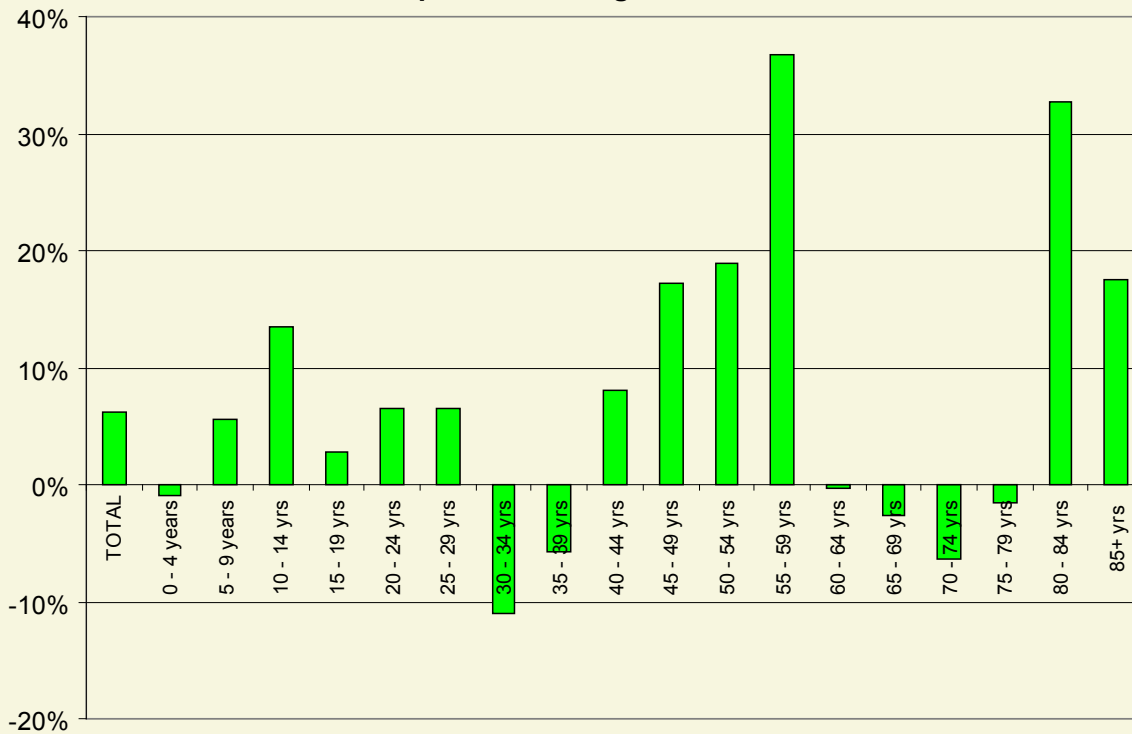

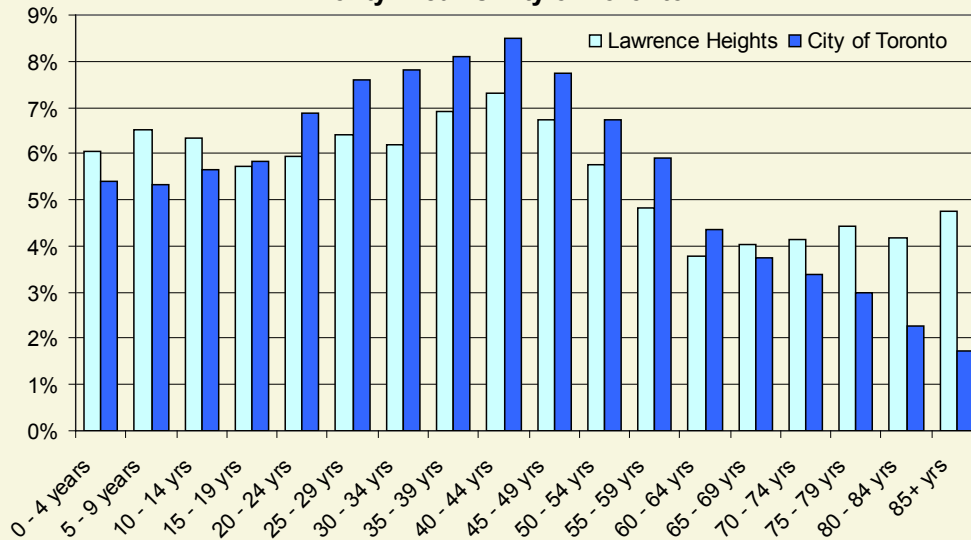
Age & Sex Profile



Population Change 2001- 2006

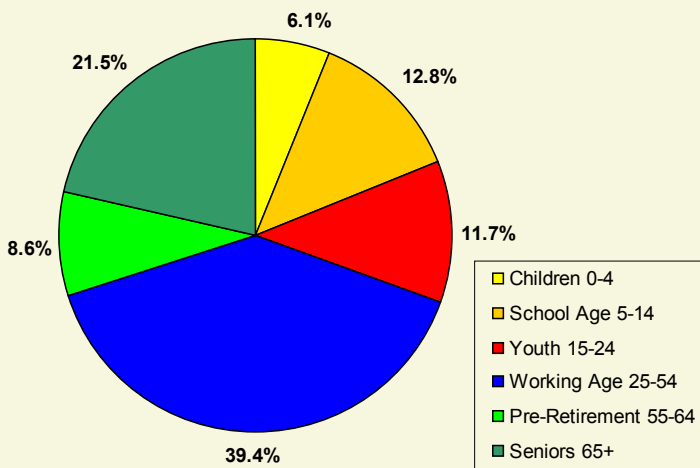

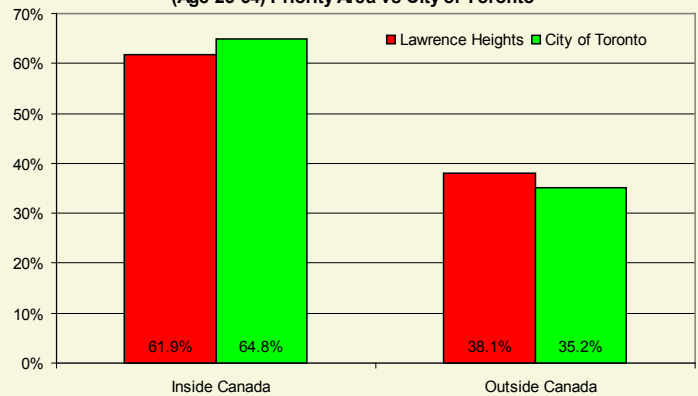

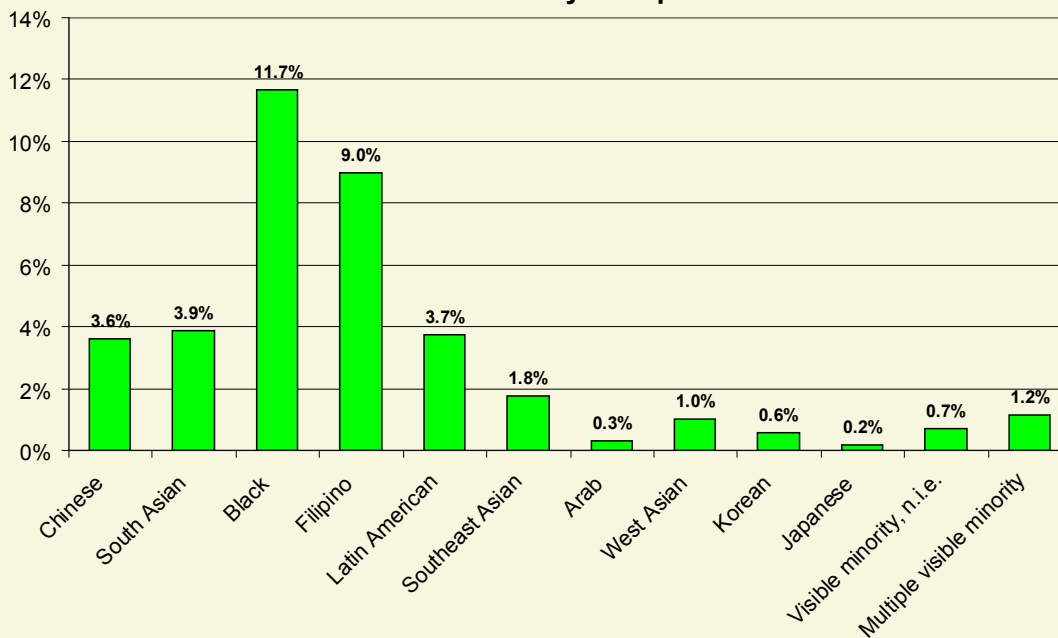


**Source of Post-secondary Education
(Age 25-64) Priority Area vs City of Toronto**



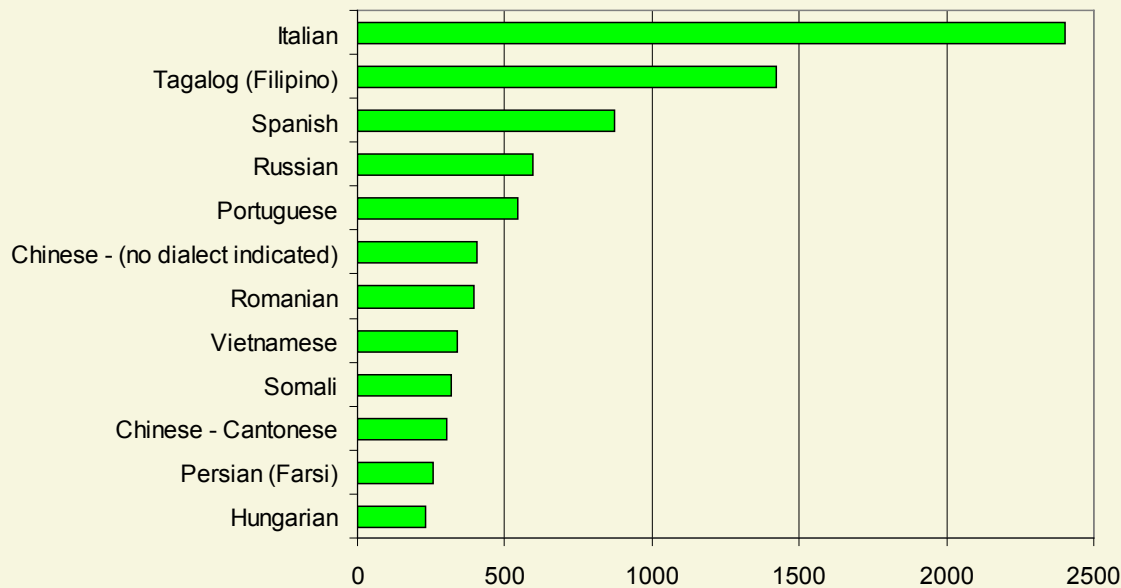

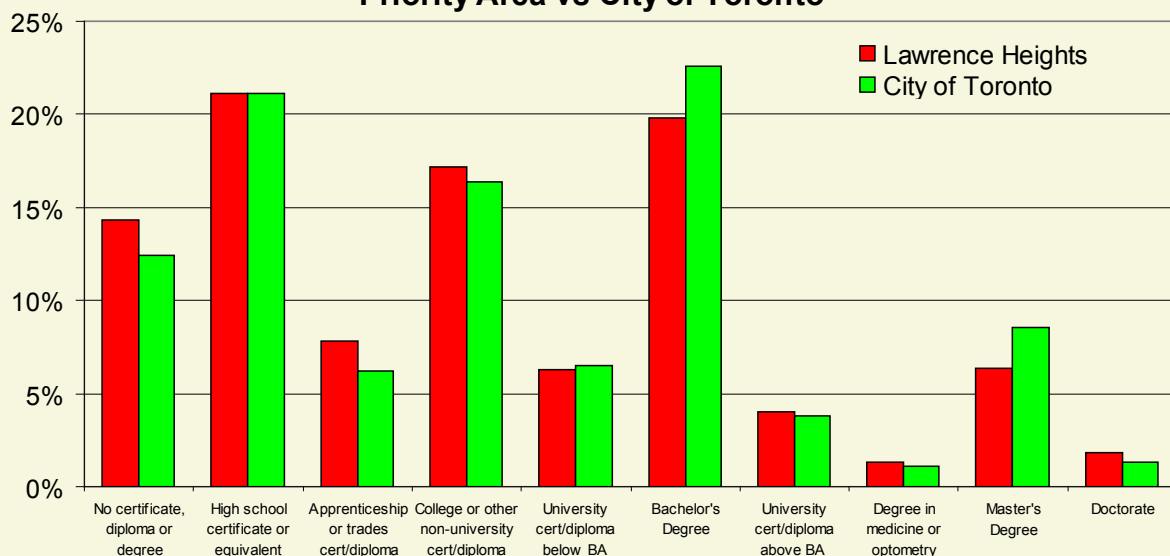

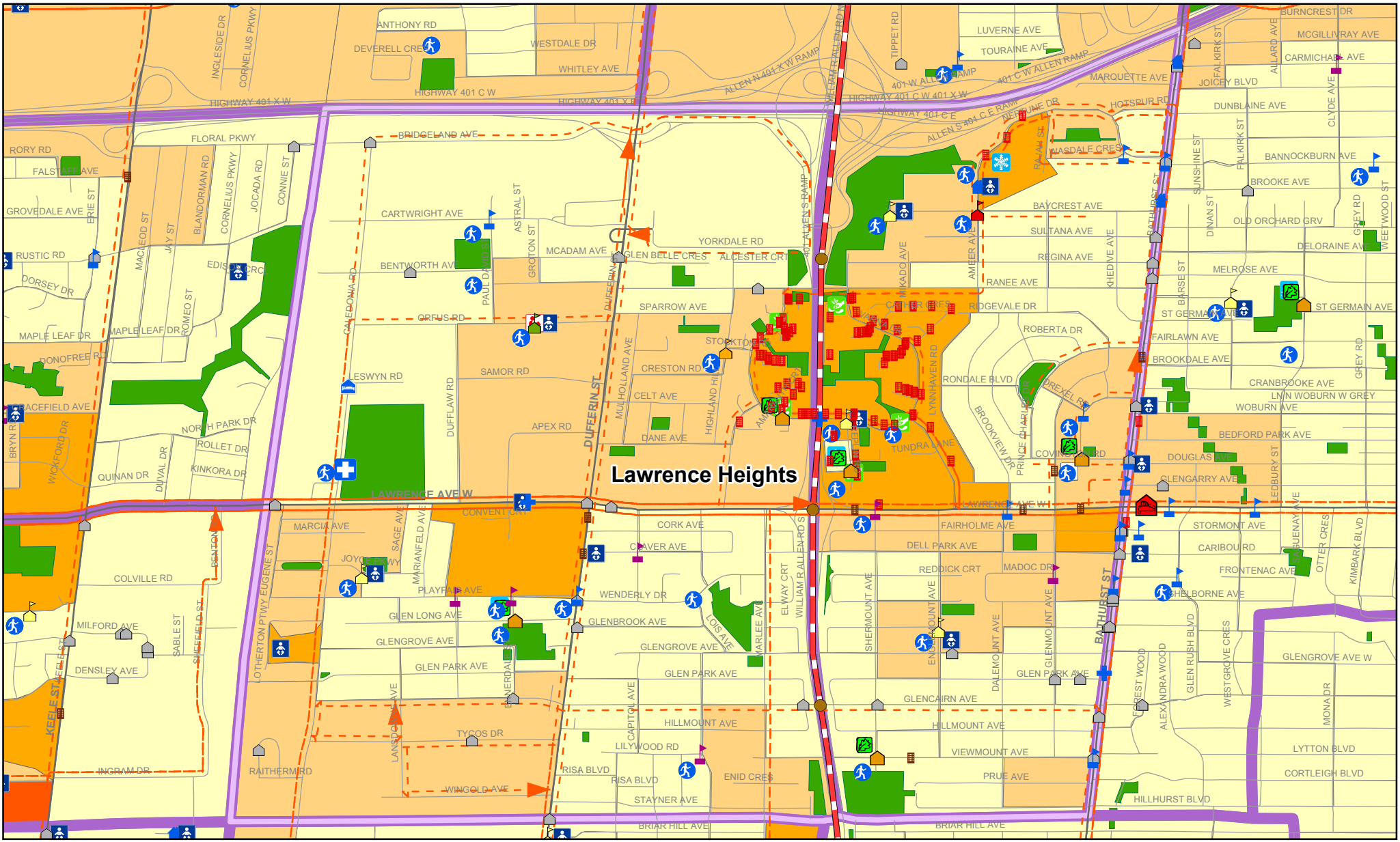

Highest Level of Education Priority Area vs City of Toronto



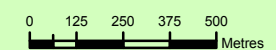
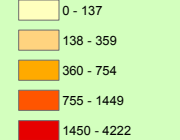
Human Services - Lawrence Heights Priority Area
