Information Sessions and Training Sessions

There will be information sessions and training sessions for community organizations before the application deadline. For dates and locations of information sessions and training sessions, please refer to the “Information Sessions and Trainings for On-line Application” flyer.

Information sessions provide an overview of the program, the priority areas, information on what has been funded in the past, and information on completing the application. The sessions will also help organizations understand the CSP application and review process

Training sessions are provided to introduce applicants to the on-line application system.

CPIP contact sheet

Programs that are not eligible for CSP funding may be eligible for funds through one of the other City of Toronto funding programs. The CPIP contact sheet provides details of other City of Toronto grants programs with contact names.

Support by contacting a staff

If your organization is located in, or serves, one of the City’s 13 priority neighbourhoods, you are encouraged to contact the Community Development Officer assigned to that neighbourhood for support and coordination of any new funding requests. To find the Community Development Officer for a particular priority neighbourhood, call 416-392-9125.

Before completing an application for CSP funding, you should review the program and organizational eligibility, assessment criteria and the self assessment checklist to ensure your request meets the requirements for CSP funding. If you are unclear about your program or organization’s eligibility, please contact an Agency Review Officer before you complete an application.
