## Due to a limited supply of vaccine, this H1N1 Clinic is restricted to people in the following priority groups:

- People under 65 with chronic health conditions
- Pregnant women
- Children 6 months to less than 5 years of age
- Health care workers
- Caregivers of infants under 6 months old and immuno-compromised people

**If you are not in one of these priority groups, you will not receive vaccine at this clinic.**

### Clinics for the general public will be announced later.

H1N1 shots are also available through some physicians' offices. Check with your doctor or community health clinic.

The priority at all H1N1 clinics is to immunize people who are most at risk to ensure they are protected as quickly as possible. The priority groups are set by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

All clinic locations are wheelchair accessible and located near public transit. Parking may be limited. Nurses will be on hand to answer questions about the vaccine.

If you have a fever or are sick please wait until you are feeling better before getting the H1N1 shot.
