Visit a sexual health clinic regularly.

You can get:

- free condoms and lubricant
- Emergency Contraceptive Pills (ECP)
- low-cost birth control pills and other methods of contraception
- pregnancy testing
- an abortion referral
- short-term counselling about sexuality/relationships
- testing and treatment for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)

Symptoms of STIs may include:

- smelly discharge from the vagina or penis
- a rash, sores or itching on or around the genitals
- burning when peeing
- pain in the abdomen

Many people who have STIs don't have any symptoms.

QUICK FACTS

You can get:

- STIs from unprotected vaginal, oral or anal sex
- Herpes or genital warts from skin to skin touching

You increase your risk of getting HIV if you have an untreated STI.

NEWS FLASH

Chlamydia is the most common reportable STI among 15-24 year olds.

In Toronto, on average, 5,000 young people are treated for chlamydia every year.

Many people don't even know that they have chlamydia, because often there are no symptoms.

GOOD NEWS:

you can treat and cure most STIs.

Condoms are good protection. If you don't always use them, get tested.
