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## What is M-DOT?

The Mobile Multi-disciplinary Street Outreach Team, M-DOT, is a mobile team of professionals who have expertise in health, mental health, co-occurring substance use issues, street outreach and homelessness.

The program aims to end street homelessness by providing timely assessment, consultation, access to medical treatment, service planning and advocacy.

Services are designed to be short-term and focused on comprehensive assessment and linking to existing resources. Consultation to outreach teams is also provided.

## How does M-DOT work?

M-DOT, accepts referrals from street outreach providers in Toronto to:

- Intensively engage the most challenged homeless individuals who have health needs
- Assess and treat those living on the street with significant illness or disability related to a health, mental health or substance use issue
- Access appropriate services within the mental health, primary care and addiction sectors
- Assist in achieving appropriate housing and address barriers to maintaining housing
- Connect with a range of appropriate ongoing supports such as case management, follow-up supports and Assertive Community Treatment Teams
