Intersection Realignment and Traffic Signal Installation on Yonge Street and Roxborough Streets East and West

Scheduled Completion Date: February 29, 2012

During the fall of 2011, the belowground work to construct the traffic signals at the above referenced intersection was completed.

Due to the specialized nature of traffic signal installation, in order to set up and activate the traffic signals, the City of Toronto's Traffic Plant Installation and Maintenance Unit, Transportation Services, will undertake the aboveground traffic signal work and the activation of the signals.

The new traffic signal at Yonge Street and Roxborough Street West is to be interconnected to the two adjacent traffic signals at Yonge Street and Crescent Street and Yonge Street and MacPherson Avenue. The interconnection work will take place on Yonge Street at between Crescent Street and MacPherson Avenue.

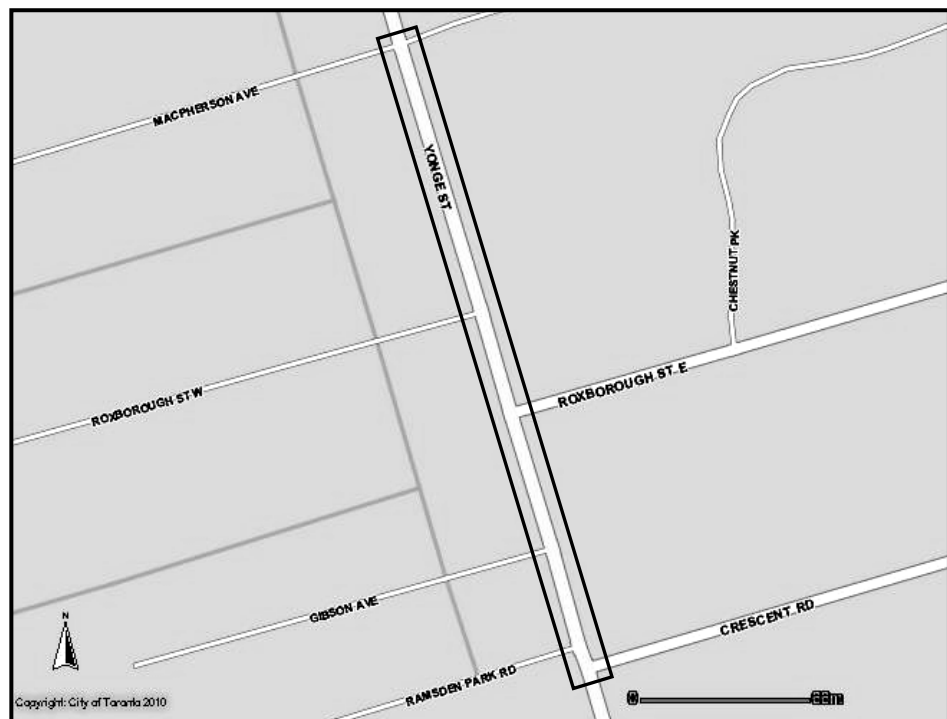
A map showing the work area is included below.

Construction Details

- On the east side of Yonge Street, a traffic signal duct will be constructed from the limits of the recent sidewalk reconstruction at Yonge Street and Roxborough Streets to MacPherson Avenue and Crescent Road.
- Aboveground traffic signal components (poles, traffic displays, controllers, etc.) will be installed on the constructed bases.
- Wiring of the



equipment will be completed.

- When co-ordination and connections to hydro and Bell communication line will be made for the signals. At this time, the signals can be activated.
- Immediately following the activation of the signals, the remaining line painting of the intersection will be completed.
- Temporary restoration of the sidewalks with asphalt and clean up will be completed.
- Permanent restoration of the sidewalks is planned to be completed during the 2012 construction season.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.
