Brian Cliff Drive Watermain Replacement & Road Resurfacing

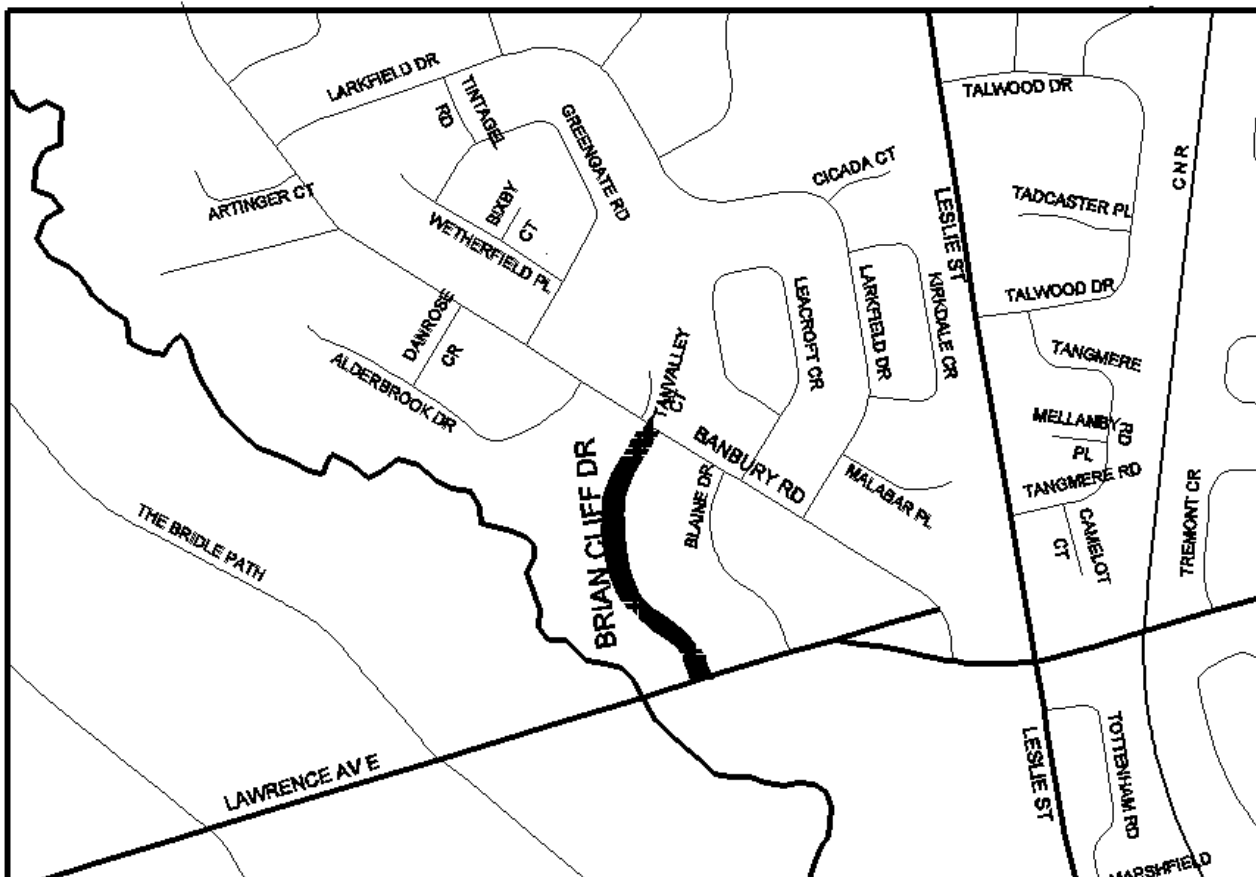
Expected Project Start Date: Week of June 20th, 2011**Expected Completion Date: October, 2011**

The City of Toronto will be undertaking water main replacement and road resurfacing on Brian Cliff Drive in order to improve the local area. This work is part of the Council approved 2011 Capital Works Program.

This construction will take place on Brian Cliff Drive from Lawrence Avenue, north to Banbury Drive. A map showing the work area is included below. Working hours will generally take place from 7am to 7pm Monday to Friday.

The construction start date is tentatively scheduled for the week of June 20th, 2011. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Project Details

The water main replacement includes, but is not limited to, excavating trench for pipe laying, water main pipe installations, water service upgrades (if substandard), pressure testing, chlorinating (disinfecting), flushing, transferring water service connections from the old water main to the new water main and restoring all areas disturbed during construction. Owners may elect to have new water services extended from the street line to their homes **AT THEIR OWN COST** as a separate contract between the home owner and contractor, only if the contractor's schedule permits.

Temporary disruptions to the water supply may occur during the construction period. Further notice will be given prior to any scheduled water supply disruption. Residents should ensure adequate precautions are taken during water supply disruptions.

This construction work will require temporary traffic lane closures. It may also mean that there is limited access to private property. The City's contractor will notify property owners of these types of disruptions beforehand. Parking arrangements will also be made if access to driveways is limited.

Many property owners have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home or business which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.
