Bloor Street West Resurfacing Jane Street to Clendenan Avenue

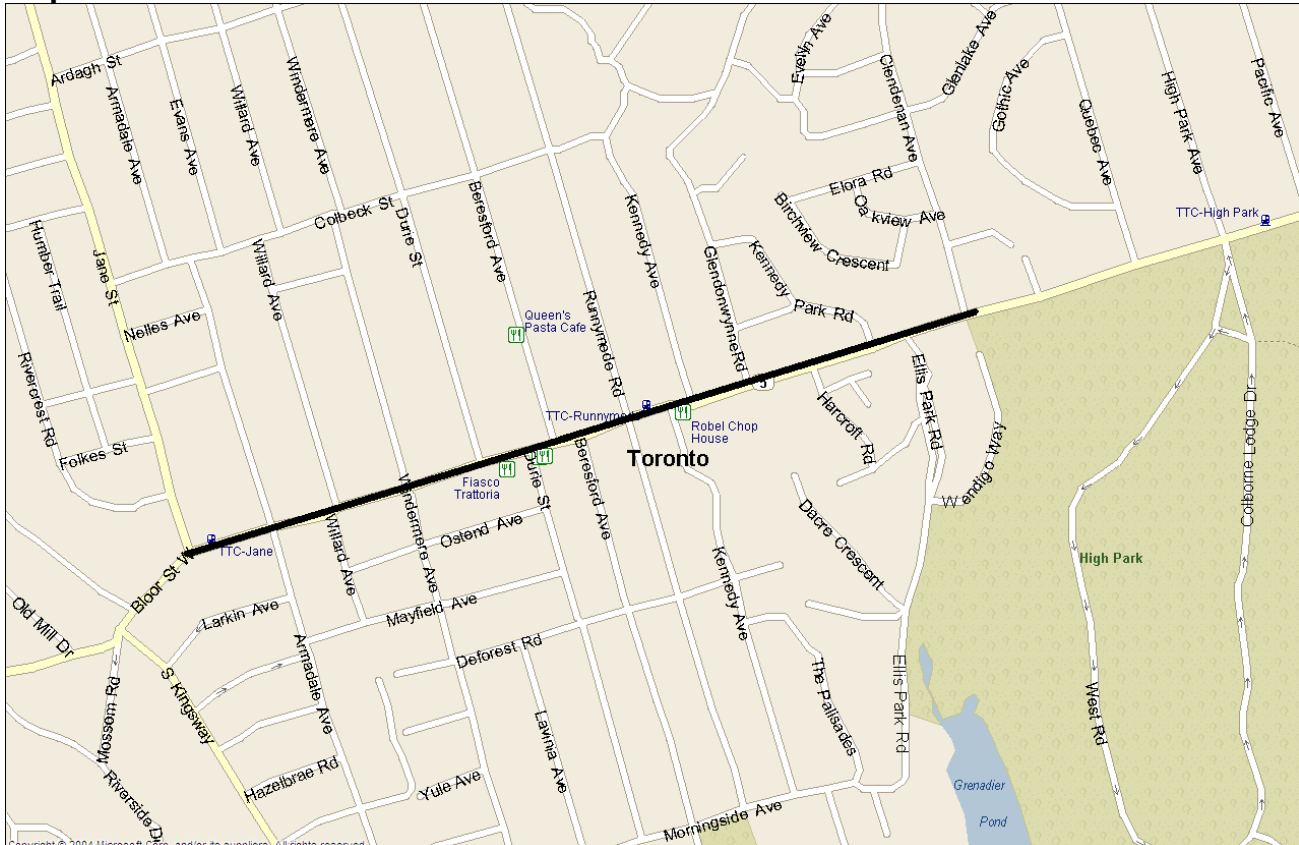
Expected Project Start Date: April 18, 2011
Expected Completion Date: October 7, 2011

The City of Toronto will be commencing the resurfacing of Bloor Street between Jane Street and Clendenan Avenue including the replacement of all curb and sidewalk and improvement to the tree pits.

A map showing the work area is included below.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Construction Details

Proposed work includes:

- Replacement of curb and sidewalk.
- Installation of pervious concrete sections over tree trenches and larger tree pit openings to promote better tree growth.
- Resurfacing of all road pavement. This will include removal of asphalt surface, repair of existing concrete base and new asphalt surface.

Work will commence with the replacement of curb and sidewalk on the south side of Bloor St. from Kennedy Avenue to Durie Street and continue through the summer approximately two blocks at a time.

Work will be suspended during several of the Bloor West Village B.I.A. special events.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. Access to all buildings will be maintained at all times. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

Parking Restrictions & Allowances

Construction will require temporary removal on on-street parking through the construction areas. The contractor will open up parking areas as much as possible. Parking will always be available in the lots north of Bloor Street.

Patios

Sidewalk replacement will require the temporary removal of patio walls and fences. Our contractor will remove, store and re-install any affected fences at no cost to the business owner. While this work will be done with great care, the City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.
