Horner Avenue Brown's Line to 66m west of Kipling Avenue Major Road Rehabilitation

Expected Project Start Date: June 22, 2011

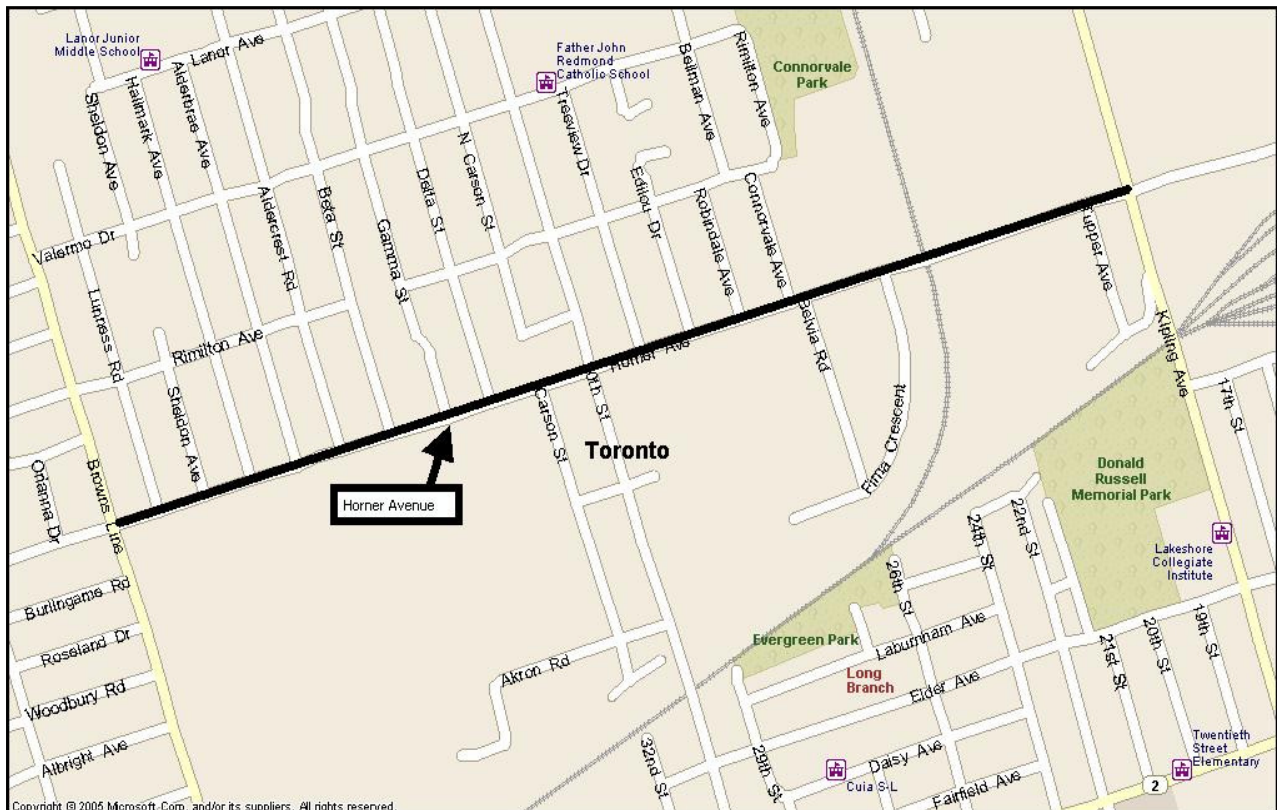
Expected Completion Date: October, 2011

The City of Toronto has scheduled the rehabilitation of Horner Avenue from Brown's Line to 66m west of Kipling Avenue. Existing bus bays in the roadway will be removed to provide larger pedestrian areas for TTC patrons. New bus shelters will be built on both sides of Horner Avenue at certain locations. This project is part of the Council-approved 2011 Capital Works Program.

This work will take place on Horner Avenue from Brown's Line to Kipling Avenue. A map showing the work area is included below.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Construction Details

Horner Avenue will be rehabilitated including removal (grinding) of existing asphalt pavement, followed by concrete road base repair, catchbasin and manhole repair, curb replacement where required, sidewalk replacement where required, new bus shelter platforms and bus waiting areas, driveway repair, boulevard improvements and new asphalt road pavement. The existing width of Horner Avenue will not change. Two lanes of vehicular traffic in each direction will remain.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. These include a reduction to one traffic lane in each direction, as required. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

Parking Restrictions & Allowances

Construction may require temporary closure of private driveways. Where the property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Further notice will be given prior to the temporary closure.
