## Fairglen Avenue

**Expected Project Start Date: Spring, 2012**  
**Expected Project Completion Date: Summer, 2012**

The City of Toronto will be undertaking construction work along Fairglen Avenue, between Altair Avenue and Beamsville Drive. The work includes road resurfacing, in order to repair the condition of the road, installing a sidewalk connection and installing a new watermain and upgrading substandard waterservices, to improve the water distribution system. Each work component has specific work limits. This project is part of the Transportation Services and Toronto Water Program.

Further notice will be given prior to construction with a more accurate start date and other information regarding the work. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

This work will take place on Fairglen Avenue. A map showing the work area is included below.

## Project Details

The City of Toronto, Technical Services, will be undertaking construction work along Fairglen Avenue, between Altair Avenue and Beamsville Drive. The type of work includes installing a new watermain, replacing all undersized water services within the said limits, resurfacing the road (Huntingwood Drive to Beamsville Drive) and installing a sidewalk (Altair Avenue to Huntingwood Drive - east-side), as part of the 2012 Transportation Capital Works and Toronto Water Program.

For the length of Fairglen Avenue between the construction limits, the replacement of curb, boulevard and driveway restoration, and sod replacement will be completed, as required.

During construction, temporary lane closures adjacent to construction zones will be enforced, as required. Business access and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times.

Any/all areas disturbed during construction will be restored to original condition.

Many people have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

## Next Steps

1. Project design is nearing completion and when complete there will be a public tender call. A contract will be awarded to the firm with the lowest bid price meeting the City's specifications.
2. A construction notice will be distributed to all residents/business in the locale of the project area prior to the start of construction.
3. The expected start date of construction is Spring 2012.
