Malvern Community Local Road Rehabilitation

Expected Project Start Date: 25 July, 2011
Expected Completion Date: 31 October, 2011

The City of Toronto will be resurfacing John Tabor Trail in order to improve the roadway and sidewalk conditions. This project is part of the 2011 Transportation Services Capital Works Program.

This work will take place on John Tabor Trail from Brenyon Way to McLevin Avenue

Construction Details

- Resurface roadway using Full Depth Reclamation recycled in-place technology
- Remove and replace curb & gutter, sidewalk as required
- Driveway modifications and reconstruction of driveway aprons as required
- Minor grading of the boulevards with 100 mm topsoil and sod as required

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

TTC Service Changes

Not applicable.

Parking Restrictions & Allowances

Construction will require temporary closure of private driveways. Where the property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Further notice will be given prior to the temporary closure.

Boulevard Work

Work in the boulevard in front of homes is expected from curb to sidewalk or street line as required. Property owners in the affected area are reminded to remove any privately owned items from the boulevard. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.
