## McCowan Road Major Road Resurfacing

**Expected Project Start Date: July 04, 2011**  
**Expected Completion Date: September 30, 2011**

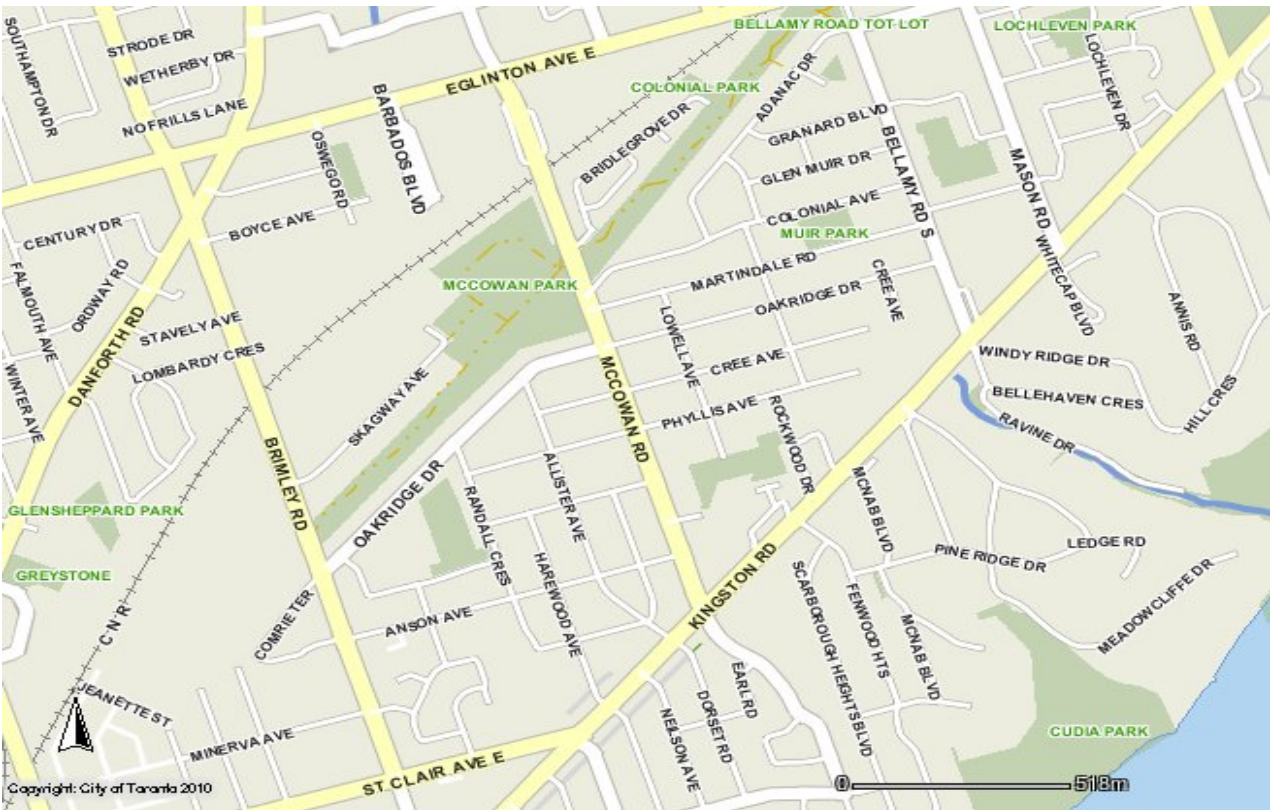
The City of Toronto will be resurfacing McCowan Road in order to improve the roadway and sidewalk conditions. This project is part of the 2011 Capital Works Program.

This work will take place on McCowan Road between Eglinton Avenue East and Kingston Road, in two phases – Eglinton Avenue East to Oakridge Drive and Oakridge Drive to Kingston Road, from July to August and from August to September respectively.

A map showing the work area is included below.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

## Construction Details

Scope of work includes:

- removal of existing asphalt and paving and repair of road base as required
- placing of topsoil and sod on re-graded areas.
- replacement of curb, gutter and sidewalk as required.

## Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

## Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. These include road closures with exemption to local traffic. The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

## Parking Restrictions & Allowances

Construction will require temporary closure of private driveways. Where the property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Further notice will be given prior to the temporary closure.

## Boulevard Work

Boulevard grading, sidewalk replacement, curb replacement and driveway reconstruction will occur in the boulevards within the right of way.

Residents or business owners may have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home or business which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.
