HORNER AVENUE MAJOR ROAD REHABILITATION Brown's Line to Kipling Avenue

Expected Project Start Date: Summer 2011
Expected Completion Date: Fall 2011

As part of the 2011 Capital Works program, the Etobicoke York District of Technical Services for The City of Toronto has scheduled the rehabilitation of Horner Avenue from Brown's Line to Kipling Avenue. Existing bus bays in the roadway will be removed to provide larger pedestrian areas for TTC patrons. New bus shelters will be built on both sides of Horner Avenue at certain locations.

This work will take place on Horner Avenue from Brown's Line to Kipling Avenue. A map showing the work area is included below.

Further notice will be given prior to construction with a more accurate start date and other information regarding the work. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Project Details

Horner Avenue will be rehabilitated including removal (grinding) of existing asphalt pavement, followed by concrete road base repair, catchbasin and manhole repair, curb replacement where required, sidewalk replacement where required, new bus shelter platforms and bus waiting areas, driveway repair, boulevard improvements and new asphalt road pavement. The existing width of Horner Avenue will not change. Two lanes of vehicular traffic in each direction will remain. No bicycle lanes will be built.

Many people have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

Next Steps

In order to complete the road rehabilitation work in a safe manner, it will be necessary to reduce traffic lanes during construction. Access to driveways will be interrupted from time to time during construction. The contractor is obligated to notify residences and businesses of any temporary driveway closures. We ask that businesses inform the City regarding critical delivery schedules so that these can be co-ordinated with the Contractor's work.

This project is currently out for tender and award is expected in June 2011. Construction work will start shortly thereafter pending all approvals being in place. A construction notice will be issued just prior to construction start indicating the name of the contractor as well as other important information.
