LABATT AVENUE Watermain and Substandard Water Service Replacement

Expected Project Start Date: September 28, 2011

Expected Completion Date: November 18, 2011

The City of Toronto will be replacing this cast iron watermain and substandard water services on Labatt Avenue in order to ensure continued safe and efficient delivery of water. The watermain that is to be replaced was first constructed between 1883 and 1898. This project is part of the Watermain and Water Service Replacement Programs.

This work will take place on Labatt Avenue from River Street to Bayview Avenue.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Construction Details

The work will consist of new watermain construction within the road followed by transferring the water services from the old watermain to the new watermain.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. Emergency and local vehicle access will be maintained but Access and storage for trucks and heavy equipment will be managed in such a way so as to minimize obstruction to private driveways and walkways.

The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

Water Service

Temporary disruption to your water supply may occur as your service is switched from the old watermain to the new watermain. Further notice will be given prior to any scheduled disruption.

Lead, galvanized metal or substandard copper water service lines from the watermain to the property line will be replaced as part of this work. This construction does not include the replacement of the private side of the water service connection – the portion of the pipe running from the property line to the building (please see the figure for an illustration). The property owner may wish to hire

their own contractor or the City’s contractor to replace the private side of the connection.

Parking restrictions/allowances

Parking and driveway access will be restricted to areas outside of the immediate work area. Construction will require temporary closure of private driveways. On street parking will be restricted to areas outside of the contractor's immediate work area.
