UPDATE Chillery Avenue and Strode Drive

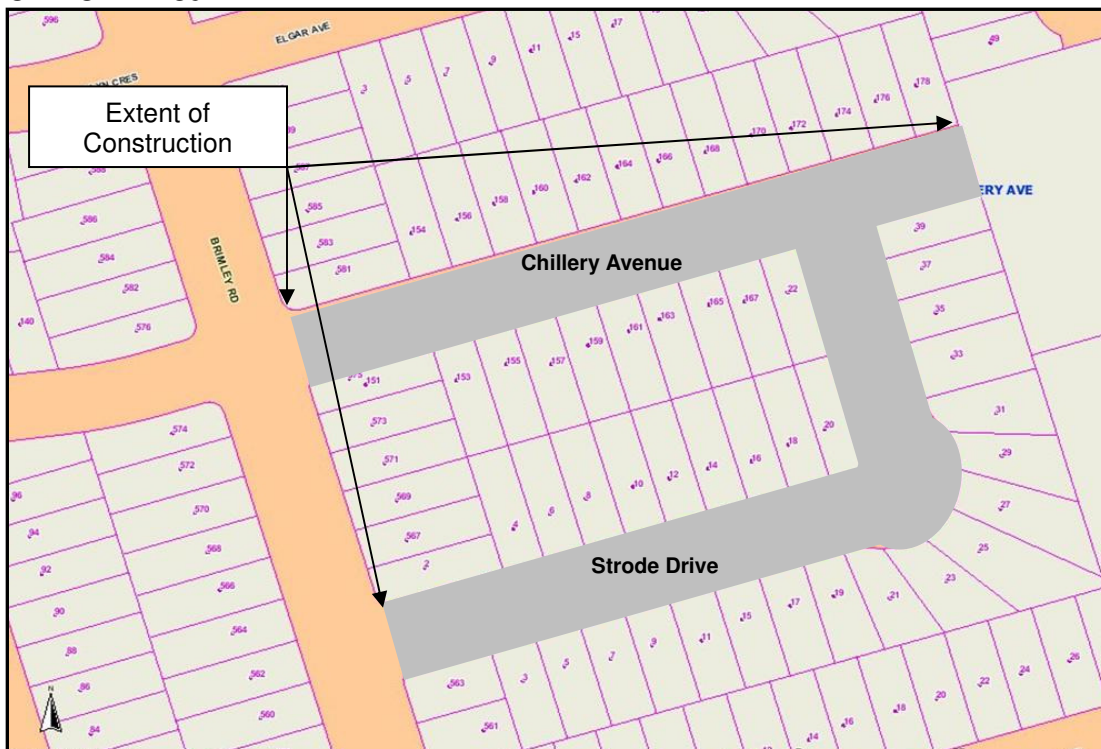
Expected Project Start Date: Summer, 2011
Expected Project Completion Date: Fall, 2011

You previously received a Public Notice about this project, dated February 10, 2010. Please note the following **revised** changes to the project.

- The installation of a new sidewalk on the south-side of Chillery Avenue and north and west-side of Strode Drive;
- The reconstruction of the pavement structure, replacement of curb, boulevard and driveway restoration, and sod replacement as required; and
- The replacing all undersized waterservices from the property line to the watermain along Chillery Avenue and Strode Drive.

This work will take place on Chillery Avenue and Strode Drive. A map showing the work area is included below.

Further notice will be given prior to construction with a more accurate start date and other information regarding the work. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and will be appreciated.

Project Details

The City of Toronto, Technical Services will be installing a new sidewalk (Chillery Avenue - south-side, Strode Drive – north and west-side) and reconstructing the pavement structure for Chillery Avenue (Brimley Road to East limit) and Strode Drive (Brimley Road to Chillery Avenue), and replacing all undersized water services, as part of the 2011 Transportation Capital Works and Toronto Water Program.

During construction, temporary lane closures adjacent to construction zones will be enforced, as required. Business access and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times.

Any/all areas disturbed during construction will be restored to original condition.

Many people have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

Next Steps

1. Project design is nearing completion and when complete there will be a public tender call. A contract will be awarded to the firm with the lowest bid price meeting the City's specifications.
2. A construction notice will be distributed to all residents/business in the locale of the project area prior to the start of construction.
3. The expected start date of construction is Summer 2011.
