Did you know that an older two-stroke mower can be more polluting than a car?

According to Environment Canada, running an older, gas-powered lawnmower for one hour is equal to driving a new car between 320 and 480 kilometres -- the distance from Toronto to Ottawa.



Two-stroke engines, found in older lawn and garden equipment, such as leaf and snow blowers, lawnmowers and trimmers, emit a high level of pollutants into the air. Join us to address this challenge as we investigate actions to reduce these emissions, including potential regulatory measures.
