Hogg's Hollow Stormwater Management and Road Improvements

Expected Project Start Date: June, 2011
Expected Completion Date: Spring, 2012

The City of Toronto will be reconstructing streets and installing storm sewers, curb and gutter in order to improve roads and stormwater management. Some watermains will also be replaced. This work is the result of the Hogg's Hollow Stormwater Management and Road Improvement Environmental Assessment, completed in 2005.

This work will take place throughout Hogg's Hollow. A map showing the work area is included below.

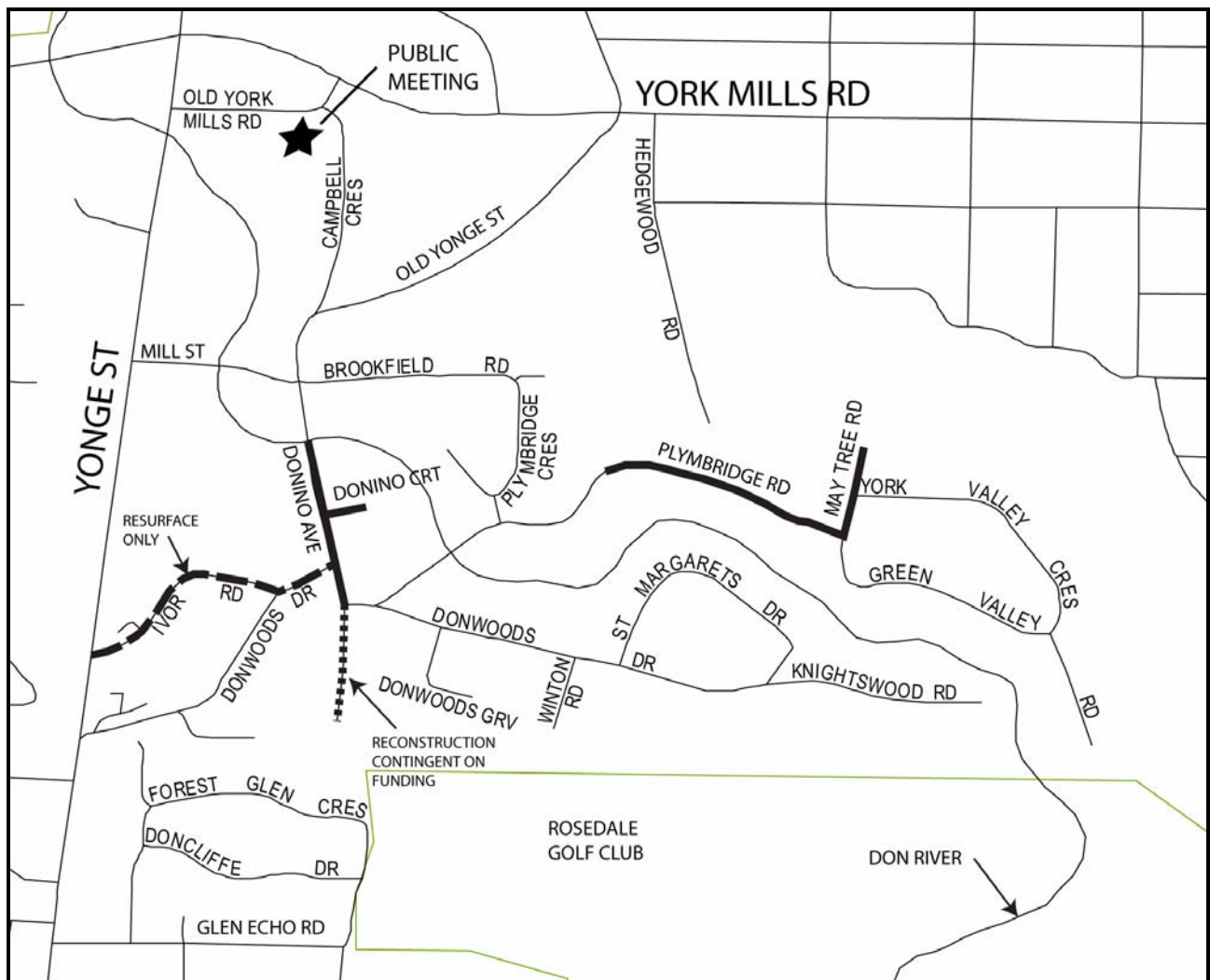

Project Details

This construction work may require temporary traffic lane closures and temporary storage of excavated materials on boulevards. It may also mean that there is limited access to private property and water shut offs for short periods of time. The City's contractor will notify property owners of these types of disruptions beforehand.

Many homeowners have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home which are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, homeowners are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City does not accept responsibility for damage to any privately owned items installed within the City's property limits.

4. Further construction notice once the schedule has been refined
