Background

The City of Toronto is conducting a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study to examine potential streetscape improvements on Roncesvalles Avenue between Queen Street West and Dundas Street West. This Study is being done in accordance with the planning and design process for 'Schedule B' projects as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environment Assessment, which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

The first Public Open House was held in July 2008. There, we provided information on the study, the challenges and opportunities identified, and the alternative solutions. A second Open House is now being held to present the results of the evaluation of the streetscape options; introduce the recommended streetscape design; and, identify the next steps of the study. Staff will be available to answer your questions and concerns.
