



Rosehill Pumping Station to Bayview Avenue and Eglinton Avenue Watermain:

Route Study and Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for the Construction of Watermain From Rosehill Pumping Station to Bayview and Eglinton Avenue East Area

NOTICE OF FILE AVAILABILITY

In July 2006, the City of Toronto initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study to determine the preferred route for a new 1650 mm watermain from Rosehill Pumping Station to the Bayview Avenue and Eglinton Avenue East area. The existing watermain was determined to have insufficient capacity to satisfy current and projected water demands.

The City of Toronto has now accepted the consultant's recommendation that the preferred route for the watermain be routed within the road allowance along Mount Pleasant Road from Rosehill Pumping Station and to Eglinton Avenue East and Bayview Avenue intersection. This preferred route falls under Schedule 'A' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document (June 2000). Schedule 'A' projects are pre-approved and may proceed to implementation. A file has been completed and describes the public and review agency consultation, identification of alternative solutions, evaluation of alternative routes, assessment of the impacts of the proposed route alignment and identification of measures to mitigate any adverse impacts. The City intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project in November 2007.
