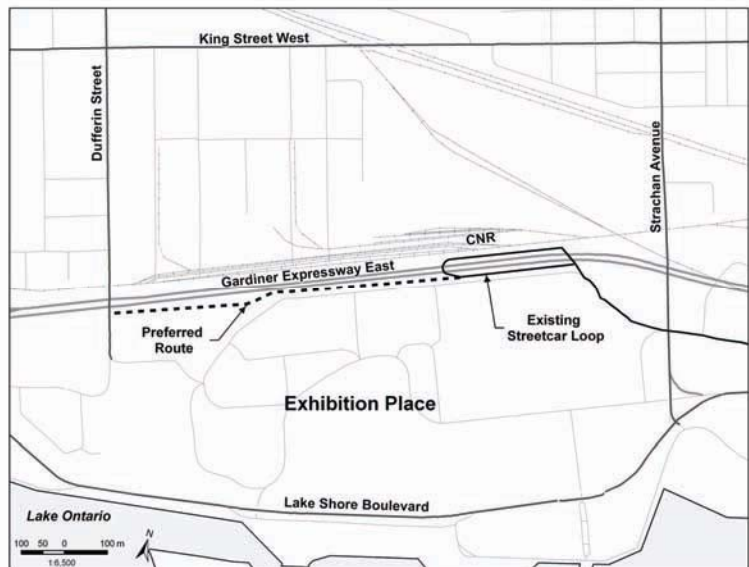

Modification Report: Exhibition Place to Dufferin Street

Project Overview

The Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) and the City of Toronto (City) have completed an Environmental Assessment (EA) Modification Study of the approved "Waterfront West Light Rail Transit Environmental Assessment" Report (1993, approved in 1995).

The Waterfront West Streetcars project will see the extension of the existing streetcar service westward from the Exhibition Place loop to Dufferin Street. The preferred route is pictured in the Key Plan.
