1. ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE BYLAWS IN THE NEW CITY OF TORONTO

Medical Officer of Health April 8, 1998

Recommending that:

- (1) The Medical Officer of Health consult with stakeholders regarding the components of a uniform Environmental Tobacco Smoke by-law and strategies to achieve the goal of 100% smoke-free public places; and
- (2) the Medical Officer of Health report back to the Board of Health by the Fall of 1998 on the outcome of stakeholder consultations and, in consultation with the City Solicitor, make recommendations for a uniform by-law and clear timelines to achieve the goal of 100% smoke-free public places.

- (2) this motion and the material from the Ontario Campaign for Action on Tobacco and the Ontario Medical Association's report entitled "Second Hand Smoke and Indoor Air Quality", which is on file in the Clerk's Department, be referred to the Toronto Board of Health for their recommendations; and
- (3) Public Hearings are held by the Board of Health to receive public input on the phasing-in of such a by-law.
- (B) <u>Lisa Jordan, Manager of Government Affairs, Ontario Restaurant Association</u> March 4, 1998

Requesting the development of a workable and attainable harmonized smoking control bylaw for Toronto's foodservice and hospitality establishments.
