Updating the Committee on the Economic Competitiveness Study which is now substantially complete; and recommending that:

- (1) the Economic Competitiveness Study form the basis for the Economic Development Strategy;
- (2) the Commissioner distribute the findings of the study to other departments and Agencies, Boards and Commissions; and
- (3) the Commissioner, prior to the submission of the Economic Development Strategy to the Committee in February, convene a workshop with Members of the Committee in early January.

Submitting, on behalf of the Toronto Association of Business Improvement Areas and the Toronto Police Service, a report entitled "Working Together to Fight Crime"; and recommending that:

- (1) the report, entitled "Working Together to Fight Crime", be forwarded to the Task Force on Community Safety to review the recommendations as contained therein, and to begin the process of developing an action plan in consultation with the Toronto Association of Business Improvement Areas and Toronto Police Service;
- (2) the Task Force on Community Safety report back to the appropriate Standing Committee and to the Policy and Finance Committee regarding the implementation and the financial implications of the recommendations contained in the "Working Together to Fight Crime" report;

- (3) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, and the North York Performing Arts Centre Corporation Emergency Committee, with the assistance of an appropriate consultant, develop a business plan for the operation of the Ford Centre for the Performing Arts that maximizes social and economic benefits to the City while minimizing the impact on the City's budget;
- (4) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer work with the Board of Directors of the St. Lawrence Centre for the Arts to develop a strategy to make the St. Lawrence Centre more self-sufficient; and
- (5) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

6. 1999 CULTURE GRANT – THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL WINTER FAIR (RAWF) (Trinity Niagara)

- (4) Council appoint the following citizens to serve on the Collections and Conservation Board for a term to begin January 1, 2000, and to expire on November 30, 2003: Mr. Geoffrey E. Geduld, Ms. Sherri Helwig, Ms. Deborah Hudson, and Ms. Betty Stein;
- (5) Council appoint the following citizens to serve on Heritage Toronto for a term to begin January 1, 2000, and to expire on November 30, 2003: Ms. S. Nina Dhar, Mr. William Greer, Mr. Lawrence L. Herman, Ms. Marion Joppe, Ms. Margaret McCaffery, Mr. David Raymont, Ms. E. Ann Rowan, Mr. Robert Stacey, Mr. John E. Twomey, and Mr. Ron Williamson;

- (6) that future citizen appointments to these boards be for three-year terms coincident with the term of Council; and
- (7) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

Advising that changes to membership of Boards of Management for Business Improvement Areas require Council approval and a by-law amendment; attaching Schedule "A" (former Toronto) Municipal Code, Chapter 20, detailing such amendments; forwarding a listing of the names of the nominees to be appointed to the Boards (Attachment No. 2); and recommending that:

- (1) amendments be made to Schedule "A", Individual Boards of Management of the (former Toronto) Municipal Code Chapter 20, Business Improvement Areas, as set out in Attachment No. 1; such changes are specific to Number of Members and Members Needed for Quorum and are highlighted by "Changes From and To";
- (2) Council appoint the nominees listed under Attachment No. 2 of this report to the Boards of Management for Parkdale Village and Queen/Broadview Village Business Improvement Areas;
- (3) the term of office to the Boards is to expire on November 30, 2000, or as soon thereafter as successors are appointed; each of the named nominees meets the requirements of Section 220 of the <u>Municipal Act</u>, as amended;

- (2) the City Clerk's Department be authorized and directed to send out notices of Council's intention to pass a by-law designating the area, as defined by Attachment No. 1, as a Business Improvement Area, in accordance with Section 220 of the <u>Municipal Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990 c.M.45, as amended;
- (3) the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to prepare a legal description of the area, as described on Attachment No. 1, and to submit this description to the City Solicitor;
- (4) subject to the City Clerk reporting favourably on the results of the poll, referred to in Recommendation No. (2), and upon receipt of the legal description prepared by the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services, the City Solicitor be directed to prepare a by-law designating a Business Improvement Area on both sides of Yonge Street from Crescent Road to the south and Woodlawn Avenue to the north, as per Attachment No. 1, in accordance with Section 220 of the <u>Municipal Act</u>; and
- (5) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

11. DESIGNATION OF CITY LIMITS BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREA (BIA) (North Toronto and North York Centre)

- (5) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.
