**MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING

City Council met in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Toronto.

CALL TO ORDER

S4.1 Mayor Lastman took the Chair and called the Members to order.

The meeting opened with O Canada.

PETITIONS AND ENQUIRIES

S4.2 Councillor Korwin-Kuczynski filed with the City Clerk, a petition containing 2,200 signatures of 'Rocket Riders', in opposition to a fare increase for the Toronto Transit Commission.

Council received the aforementioned petition.

S4.3 Councillor Walker filed with the City Clerk, a petition containing 27 signatures of residents of 310-320 Tweedsmuir Avenue, in support of the restoration of rent controls and rental housing protection in Toronto.

Council received the aforementioned petition.

S4.4 Councillor Minnan-Wong presented the following Report for consideration by Council:

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**CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS
CLAUSES WITH MOTIONS, VOTES, ETC.**

S4.7 Clause No. 1 of Report No. 8 of The Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee, headed “1999 Operating Budget”.

The Chief Administrative Officer and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer gave a presentation to the Council in regard to the 1999 Operating Budget.

Councillor Tom Jakobek, with the permission of Council, addressed the Council as Chair of the Budget Committee and expressed his appreciation to the staff who had participated in the 1999 Operating Budget process.

Councillor Jakobek in the Chair.

COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBOURHOOD SERVICES

S4.7.1 A Children’s Services Program

Motions:

- (a) Councillor Cho moved that the Clause be amended by deleting from Recommendation No. (9) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee, the word “non-salary”.
- (b) Councillor Shaw moved that motion (a) by Councillor Cho be amended adding the following:

“and adding thereto the words ‘subject to confirmation of 80 percent cost-sharing by the Province of Ontario; the Commissioner of Community and Neighbourhood Services be requested to submit a report to the Community Services Committee in July, 1999, outlining the provincial position in this regard; and, should the Province of Ontario not agree to this cost-sharing, the City of Toronto release the \$3.3 million by September 1, 1999’.”

Carried by a majority of 30.

The Children's Services Program (A) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

In summary, Council amended Recommendation No. (9) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee to read as follows:

- “(9) A one time only adjustment of \$3.3 million be made as a down payment towards paying the actual cost of operating Child Care Centres and that this amount be found within the existing 1999 Child Care Operating Budget, subject to confirmation of 80 percent cost sharing by the Province of Ontario; the Commissioner of Community and Neighbourhood Services be requested to submit a report to the Community Services Committee in July, 1999, outlining the provincial position in this regard; and, should the Province of Ontario not agree to this cost-sharing, the City of Toronto release the \$3.3 million by September 1, 1999.”

S4.7.2 E Homes for the Aged

Motion:

Councillor Augimeri moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Community and Neighbourhood Services be requested to submit a report to the Community Services Committee, as soon as possible, on the impact of:

- (a) the loss of \$15 million in provincial funding for long-term care which has occurred since 1996; and
- (b) the additional long-term care funding initiatives recently announced by the provincial government.”

The Homes for the Aged (E) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, CULTURE AND TOURISM

S4.7.3 **Q Special Events**

Motion:

Councillor Layton moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be requested to submit a report to the Economic Development Committee for its meeting to be held in May, 1999, on the possibility of including the ‘Taste of the Danforth Festival’ as a City of Toronto signature event, and the City’s endorsement thereof.”

The Special Events (Q) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

SPECIAL PURPOSE BODIES

S4.7.4 **KK Library**

Motion:

Councillor McConnell moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the City Librarian, Toronto Public Library, be requested to submit a report to the Policy and Finance Committee, in the fall of 1999, on the level of funding required for multi-lingual materials, such report to include the amount of funds expended to that date in this regard.”

The Library (KK) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

CORPORATE SERVICES

S4.7.5 **U Clerk's**

Motion:

Councillor Adams moved that the Clause be amended by adding to Recommendation No. (88) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee, the words "the Corporate Communications Division of the Corporate Services Department", so that such recommendation shall now read as follows:

"(88) \$15,300.00 be maintained and the funding be provided from the appropriate program budgets of Special Events, Clerk's Division, Facilities and Real Estate Division and the Corporate Communications Division of the Corporate Services Department;"

Votes:

The motion by Councillor Adams carried.

The Clerk's (U) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

SPECIAL PURPOSE BODIES

S4.7.6 **HH Toronto and Region Conservation Authority**

Motion:

Councillor Augimeri moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

"It is further recommended that the City Solicitor be requested to submit a report to the Administration Committee on the legal implications of Recommendation No. (140) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee, viz.:

"(140) the by-law in respect to Councillors' salaries be changed to the normal set amount minus the amount received from Agencies, Boards and Commissions and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, and that it be done in a way so that it does not impact the Councillor's pension;"

Votes:

The motion by Councillor Augimeri carried.

The Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (HH) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

URBAN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

S4.7.7 **S Urban Planning and Development Services**

Motion:

Councillor Johnston, seconded by Councillor Rae, moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Urban Planning and Development Services be requested to report to the Planning and Transportation Committee, the Policy and Finance Committee, and the Community Councils, for subsequent submission to Council in June, 1999, addressing concerns regarding the adequacy of the number of City planning staff, particularly in the following areas:

- (a) community planning;
- (b) building permit processing;
- (c) municipal standards inspection; and
- (d) the construction building code review.”

Votes:

The motion by Councillor Johnston, seconded by Councillor Rae, carried.

The Urban Planning and Development Services (S) component of the 1999 Operating Budget, as amended, carried.

WORKS AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

S4.7.8 **I Solid Waste Management**

Motions:

- (a) Councillor Pantalone moved that the Clause be amended by amending Recommendation No. (39)(e)(ii) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee to provide that the stated rates be charged on an annualized basis and that the projected revenue be revised accordingly.
- (b) Councillor Layton moved that the Clause be amended by:

- (1) deleting Recommendations Nos. (39)(e)(i) to (39)(e)(v) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- “(e) (i) that there be no charge for garbage collection for small businesses in the City of Toronto; and
- (ii) any business may choose to reduce its number of weekly collections, provided it is able to store its waste materials on-site in a manner satisfactory to the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services and the Medical Officer of Health;”;

- (2) adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to quickly develop a program for wet waste collection from businesses in the City of Toronto, for compost purposes, at no charge to businesses, and the Works Committee be requested to consider options for a pilot project, such project to be implemented as soon as possible.”

- (c) Councillor Holyday moved that the Clause be amended by deleting Recommendation No. (39)(a)(ii) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee, viz.:

- “(ii) a program be phased in over three years in the summer months across the City for non-recyclable materials only at a cost of \$800 thousand in 2000, an additional \$1 million in 2001, and \$1 million in 2002.”

- (d) Councillor Korwin-Kuczynski moved that the Clause be amended by:

- (1) deferring consideration of Recommendation No. (39)(e)(ii) respecting service fees for garbage and recycling collection for areas where these charges are not in effect, for discussion in the year 2000; and
- (2) transferring \$1.2 million from the tax deficiencies budget to the Solid Waste Management budget to cover the shortfall.

- (e) Councillor Bossons moved that the Clause be amended by:

- (1) amending Recommendation No. (39)(e) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee:
- (a) to provide that small commercial properties now using multiple garbage collection be given the option to use fewer pick-ups than current; and

- (b) by deleting Parts (iii) and (iv) and amending Part (ii) to take effect on January 1, 2000; and
- (2) adding thereto the following:
 - “It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to submit a report to the Works Committee:
 - (a) at the end of 1999, on the impact of any fee for service program; and
 - (b) on a fee-per-bag system of funding commercial garbage collection, by December, 1999.”
- (f) Councillor Miller moved that the Clause be amended by striking out Recommendation No. (39)(e) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
 - “(e) Garbage and Recycling Collection for Small Commercial Properties
 - (i) existing service levels and eligibility criteria for garbage and recyclable collection service to the small commercial sector currently receiving this service be maintained until the end of the year 2000; and
 - (ii) the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services, in consultation with Members of Council and the small business community, be requested to report to the Works Committee by March, 2000, on:
 - (a) harmonizing eligibility criteria for garbage and recyclables collection service to the small commercial garbage sector;
 - (b) providing equivalent service levels to small businesses (restaurants and green-grocers) with similar characteristics to business communities receiving multiple weekly garbage collection; and
 - (c) proposals to creatively address the issue, such as composting altering the number of days of service, etc.”
- (g) Councillor Jones moved that:
 - (1) motion (c) by Councillor Holyday be amended by adding thereto the following:

“and that Recommendation No. (39)(a)(iii) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee be also deleted, viz.:

(iii) staff report back to the Works Committee by October 1999, with the proposed eligibility criteria for residential areas that would receive summer twice a week garbage collection in 2000, and the associated cost impacts;”;

(2) adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to submit a report to the Works Committee, after consultation with the Lake Shore Boulevard West Business Improvement Area, on the possibility of reinstating twice per week garbage collection on Lake Shore Boulevard West in the former City of Etobicoke, and reverting the collection service to Tuesdays and Fridays.”

(h) Councillor King moved that Part (2) of motion (b) by Councillor Layton be amended by deleting the words “quickly develop” and inserting in lieu thereof the words “report on the feasibility of quickly developing”.

(i) Councillor Rae moved that the Clause be amended by deleting Recommendation No. (39)(a)(iv) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee.

(j) Councillor Lindsay Luby moved that the Clause be amended by adding to Recommendation No. (39)(a)(ii) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee the following:

“and a residential garbage program be phased-in over three years in the summer months across the City for non-recyclable materials only after a survey of residents determines whether or not they perceive a real need for twice-a-week pick up in the summer.”

(k) Councillor Tzekas moved that Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that, if the proposal for twice-a-week residential garbage is deleted, the funds saved be used to offset commercial garbage needs in the City.”

(l) Councillor Giansante moved that:

(1) the Clause be amended by deleting from Recommendation No. (39)(a)(i) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee the date “September 1, 1999” and inserting in lieu thereof the date “June 1, 1999”; and

- (2) any savings derived by changing the date to June 1, 1999, be left in a reserve account to address this issue in the 2000-2001 Operating Budget.
- (m) Councillor Sgro moved that the Clause be amended by deleting Recommendation No. (39)(a)(iv) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- “(iv) there be no twice-a-week residential garbage collection throughout the entire City of Toronto in the summer months, effective September 1, 1999.”

 - (iii) that the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be requested to develop a comprehensive policy related to fees charged and revenues generated by all City Departments, Agencies, Boards and Commissions, with respect to filming, in an effort to have a consistent and fair approach to supporting this important economic sector, and that no fees be levied over and above those stipulated as part of the charge."
- (c) Councillor Shiner moved that Part (2) of motion (b) by Councillor Ashton be amended to include consultation with the Board of Directors of the Canadian Film Centre, and that such motion, as amended, be referred to the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism for a report thereon to Council, through the Economic Development and Parks Committee.

“(iv) the City’s share of the GO Transit 1998 budget surplus, estimated at \$5 million, be directed to the 1999 Operating Budget of the Toronto Transit Commission.”; and
 - (4) by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to review the revenue generated by automobiles (e.g., parking fees, parking tags, etc.) and report thereon to the Planning and Transportation Committee, and further, that the Committee be directed to recommend to City Council what portion of the revenue should be allocated to the Toronto Transit Commission.”

Councillor Chong in the Chair.

- (b) Councillor Ootes moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following

“It is further recommended that the Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) be requested to approve a 10 cent fare increase as recommended by the Chief General Manager, Toronto Transit Commission.”

(c) Councillor Miller moved that:

(1) Part (2) of motion (a) by Councillor Moscoe be amended to provide that the Toronto Transit Commission’s operating subsidy be funded by amending Recommendation No. (213)(i) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee by deleting from such recommendation the figure “\$25 million” and inserting in lieu thereof the figure “\$11.4 million” so that the recommendation shall now read as follows:

“(i) capital from current contributions be increased by \$11.4 million for the 1999 operating budget, and approval in principle be confirmed for additional increases of \$7 million, \$0 million, \$7 million, and \$24 million in the year 2000 through 2003 respectively, totalling a minimum of \$38 million annually over the next four budget years, to continue to address the Toronto Transit Commission’s capital shortfall;”; and

(2) the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the City of Toronto establish a reserve fund for the TTC in order to stabilize funding over time, such fund to be operated on the basis that any TTC operating surplus shall be paid in, and any TTC operating deficit shall, to the limit of the fund’s balance, be funded therefrom.”

Councillor Jakobek in the Chair.

(d) Councillor Kinahan moved that the Clause be amended by adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that:

(1) to avoid a fare increase for the next two months, the City of Toronto make available to the Toronto Transit Commission a temporary loan of \$3 million automatically callable on July 1, 1999;

(2) the Mayor (along with all Members of Council) be requested to vigorously lobby the federal and provincial governments to grant enough monies (approximately \$13.6 to \$17.8 million) to avoid a fare increase for the entire year;

- (3) the Toronto Transit Commission be requested to repay the said temporary loan from any federal or provincial grants that may be forthcoming; and
- (4) in the event that no federal or provincial grants are forthcoming:
 - (a) the City of Toronto increase its Toronto grant to the Toronto Transit Commission by \$4.5 million to cover the repayment of the \$3 million temporary loan and to cover the loss of revenue for the month of July while the fare increase takes effect (\$1.5 million); and
 - (b) the Toronto Transit Commission be requested to raise its fares in accordance with the recommendations of the Toronto Transit Commission's Chief General Manager (approximately 10 cents a fare or 5 percent)."
- (e) Councillor Korwin-Kuczynski moved that the Clause be amended by:
 - (1) amending Recommendations Nos. (218) and (220) of the Strategic Policies and Priorities Committee to provide that the \$1.73 million reserve for adjustments to the provincial subsidy and \$237,000.00 revenue from parking tags be transferred to the Toronto Transit Commission to prevent a fare increase for students and seniors; and
 - (2) adding thereto the following:

“It is further recommended that the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, in consultation with the President of the Toronto Parking Authority, be requested to submit a report to Council, through the Policy and Finance Committee, by September, 1999, on the feasibility of implementing a \$1.00 levy that could be charged on private and public parking in the City of Toronto, to offset future TTC fare increases.”

“It is further recommended that the TTC and the Chief Administrative Officer be requested to report to Council, through the Planning and Transportation Committee, no later than June, 1999, on:

 - (1) an appropriate formula for the next two years for funding the Toronto Transit Commission's Operating Budget between the TTC's own revenue and the City's tax base; and
 - (2) how the TTC would divide (between operational requirements and transit expansion) any proceeds from gasoline taxes presently collected by the

federal and provincial governments, if and when such taxes become available for public transit.”
