- (3) forward this report to the City of Toronto for Council approval of the required 2000 operating subsidy of \$152.7 million, noting that this is the level required to maintain the Council approved policy of the City funding 20 percent of cost and TTC revenue 80 percent;
- (4) consider this report in concert with the following reports:
 - (a) Wheel-Trans 2000 Operating Budget; and
 - (b) 2000-2004 TTC Capital Program;
