1. TORONTO CYCLING MASTER PLAN STUDY TORONTO CYCLING SURVEY – RESULTS OF DECIMA RESEARCH INC.

Advising that the presentation on the Final Report on the Toronto Cycling Survey, prepared by Decima Research Inc., will include the following information:

2. TORONTO CYCLING MAP.

 2a. Communication addressed to Mr. Sean Wheldrake, Bicycle Promotion Coordinator <u>from Cary Weitzman</u> (March 27, 2000)

Advising, for the reasons outlined in the communication, that the route listed on the Toronto Cycling Map in the area between Dufferin Street and Keele Street, north of Caledonia Road, is potentially hazardous in that it appears to be in an active rail corridor.

2b. Mr. Bruce Cadenhead <u>Allanway Consulting Incorporated</u> (March 29, 2000)

Advising that the following public comment was received on March 27, 2000 by the Toronto Transportation's Public Information System, ROAD INFO telephone line:

"It's about the Toronto Cycling Map. Wondering why the cemeteries are marked with crosses, not everyone believes in crosses. Wondering why there isn't just a square with a tombstone in it or something generic."

3. BICYCLE PARKING AT UNION STATION.

Mr. Geoff McBride Advocacy for Respect for Cyclists (March 9, 2000)

Respecting the lack of bicycle parking at Union Station; and requesting that the City of Toronto:

- (1) install post and ring bicycle racks on the property immediately to solve the bicycle problem in the short term;
- (2) research and implement long-term bicycle parking solutions (i.e. bike lockers, supervised check-ins); and
- (3) initiate a Community Economic Development indoor bike parking business.

4. CAN-BIKE PROGRAM.

Requesting the Committee to endorse, on a no-charge basis, a one-day session for Committee Members who have completed a Can-Bike 2 course.
