# 5. BIKE THEFT STICKERS.

Advising the Toronto Cycling Committee that:

- (1) the City of Toronto has received 1,600 stickers, with the slogan "bike theft = bad karma" written on them;
- (2) the stickers were produced by Grassroots Environmental Products, and will be distributed by the Road and Trail Safety Ambassadors; and
- (3) the slogan on the stickers will raise awareness about the issue of bike theft in the City of Toronto and attempt to discourage bike theft.

#### 6. TRANSIT SHELTER POSTER – 1 METRE SPACE FOR MOTORISTS.

Advising the Toronto Cycling Committee that:

- (1) a small version of the transit shelter poster (1 Metre Space For Motorists) will be available for viewing at the July 17, 2000 meeting of the Toronto Cycling Committee; and
- (2) the poster will be displayed in Toronto transit shelters beginning July 31, 2000.

#### 7. MOTORCYCLE PARKING SPACES.

City Clerk (June 14, 2000)

Advising that the Works Committee at its meeting held on June 14, 2000, adopted the following motion:

- (1) recommended to Council the adoption of the report (May 26, 2000) from the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services recommending that a pilot project delineating parking spaces for the exclusive use by motorcycles be implemented and that "Motorcycle Parking Spaces" be installed at the following locations; and
- (2) referred the report to the Toronto Cycling Committee for consideration of that portion relating to bicycle parking.

(<u>CO-CHAIRS NOTE</u>: SUGGESTED DISPOSITION – That Works and Emergency Services staff be requested to identify locations where there is insufficient sidewalk space to meet the bicycle parking demand; and that it is feasible to locate bicycle parking on the roadway.)

#### 8. OUR TORONTO WATERFRONT PLAN: THE NEW CANADA GATEWAY.

Recommending that the Toronto Cycling Committee:

- (3) strike a working group to monitor and respond to issues related to the Toronto waterfront redevelopment plan.

#### 9. DOWNSVIEW PARK PLAN.
