3. CYCLISTS ON SIDEWALKS.

Communication addressed to Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services from City Clerk, Toronto Pedestrian Committee (October 24, 2000)

Advising that the Toronto Pedestrian Committee, at its meeting held on October 18, 2000, had before it a communication (August 24, 2000) from Councillor Jane Pitfield, Ward One, East York, addressed to Mayor Mel Lastman concerning cyclists on the sidewalks; and that Councillor Jane Pitfield appeared before the Toronto Pedestrian Committee; and that the Toronto Pedestrian Committee:

- (1) requested the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services to submit a report to the Toronto Pedestrian Committee providing information on:
 - (a) the seriousness of this problem;
 - (b) the number of pedestrian/cyclist accidents on sidewalks; and
 - (c) engineering approaches to discourage bicycling on sidewalks;
- (2) advised the Toronto Cycling Committee of the Toronto Pedestrian Committee's action in this regard and requested the Toronto Cycling Committee to provide their comments with respect thereto; and
- (3) requested the Toronto Police Services to submit a report to the Toronto Pedestrian Committee, such report to provide comments with respect to:
 - (a) levels of recent enforcement with respect to bicycles on sidewalks; and

(b) the feasibility of increasing enforcement activity in this regard.
