7. SHERWOOD PARK/SUNNYBROOK PARK – DOGS OFF-LEASH (North Toronto)

- (2) signs be erected in Sunnybrook Park advising the public of the designated area, as shown on Attachment No. 1; and
- (3) when a portion of Sunnybrook Park is implemented as a dogs off-leash area, Sherwood Park be designated a dogs on-leash area.

8. CITY OF TORONTO CULTURE PLAN (All Wards)

Responding to a request from the November 29, 1999 meeting of the Economic Development and Parks Committee that the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism provide a report on a plan for Culture, Arts and Heritage; and a further request from the March 20 and March 27, 2000 meeting of the Economic

Development and Parks Committee that the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, in consultation with the Toronto Arts Council, review and report on ways of increasing revenues to the City's arts and culture sector without putting additional pressures on the property tax base; and recommending that:

- (1) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism develop a Culture Plan for the City of Toronto, in consultation with community partners, including the elements outlined in this report; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

9. TORONTO BIOTECHNOLOGY INCUBATOR COMMERCIALIZATION CENTRE (TBCC)

Seeking endorsement, in principle, from Council for the development of a private-public partnership that will create a biotechnology business incubator in Toronto; informing Council of a request by the Toronto Biotechnology Commercialization Centre (TBCC) Board of Directors for City financial support for the incubator; and recommending that:

- (1) Council endorse, in principle, the efforts of the Board of Directors of the TBCC to develop a biotechnology business incubator in Toronto;
- (2) the appropriate City officials be directed to evaluate the feasibility of the TBCC Board request for City funding and report back on specific actions and recommendations;
- (3) the applicability of this project be reviewed for consideration under the Federal/Provincial/Municipal infrastructure program; and
- (4) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

10. DESIGN TAX CREDIT

11. "COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE" – STATISTICS CANADA AND THE CITY OF TORONTO (All Words)

Proposing an approach to elevate the participation of Toronto residents in the 2001 Census; advising that increased local participation in this national enumeration will yield information/data that is of long term value and benefit to the City; and recommending that:

- (1) the City support, in principle, enhancing participation levels of Toronto residents in the 2001 Census;
- (2) a "Complete Count" Committee be established to unite the efforts of Statistics Canada and the City of Toronto in promoting the 2001 Census, the committee to be chaired by Councillor George Mammoliti with the participation of two other Councillors as well as staff representatives from City departments and agencies whose facilities or services can contribute to this effort including: Office of the Mayor, Economic Development, Parks and Recreation, Special Events, Corporate Services, Urban Planning and Development Services, Community and Neighbourhood Services, Finance, Toronto Housing Company, Toronto Public Library, as well as members of the community at large;
- (3) upon completion of the Census in 2001, Statistics Canada and the City look to ways to enhance the quality, depth and range of data collected about households and businesses in the City of Toronto; and
- (4) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

12. LAWRENCE HEIGHTS WATERPLAY

(North York Spadina)

Requesting approval of a change of location for the Lawrence Heights Waterplay and that funds from the Bathurst Heights outdoor basketball account be re-directed to the waterplay account; and recommending that:

- (1) Council approve the change of location for the waterplay from Lawrence Heights Community Centre to two separate locations within Flemington Park, one on the east side of the Allen Expressway and one on the west side;
- (2) Council approve the transfer of \$40,000.00 from the approved \$90,000.00 for Bathurst Heights outdoor basketball account to these waterplay facilities; and
- (3) the appropriate City official be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

13. CHARTER OPERATOR FOR THE TRILLIUM

- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.
