Reporting, as requested by the Economic Development and Parks Committee on February 14, 2000, on the feasibility of implementing a Provincial withholding tax, levied on the salaries of the members of visiting professional sports teams; and recommending that this report be received for information.

2. SOUTH ETOBICOKE REGENERATION PROJECT – BLUEPRINT FOR ACTION LAKESHORE-QUEENSWAY

(DEPUTATION ITEM)

Presenting the South Etobicoke Regeneration Project's report, Blueprint for Action (Attachment No. 1); describing the process for implementation of the Blueprint; and recommending that:

- (1) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be requested to hold a meeting, at the earliest possible time, with the Commissioners of Works and Emergency Services, Urban Development Services, Community and Neighbourhood Services, and the Chair of the South Etobicoke Regeneration Project to review the Blueprint for Action and to discuss assistance to the workgroups of the South Etobicoke Regeneration Project as described in the body of this report;
- (2) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, upon completion of the prioritization of the projects as described in Phase Two of this report and in consultation with the departments referred to in Recommendation No. (1), be requested to report further concerning the recommendations for implementation of the South Etobicoke Regeneration Project's Blueprint for Action, including financial and human resource implications, and the involvement of the private, public and non-profit sectors; and

(3) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be requested to forward copies of the Blueprint for Action to appropriate staff of the Ministry of Economic Development, Trade and Tourism, Human Resources Development Canada, the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, the Etobicoke Chamber of Commerce, and other interested parties.

3. BOAT CLUB LEASES – RENTAL RATE AND FUTURE RENEWAL

Reporting on the current status of the various boat club leases across the Toronto Waterfront; recommending a rental rate adjustment for the balance of the term; providing a policy framework for the renewal of leases in the longer term; and recommending that:

- (1) the annual rental rates for boating facilities covered by the former Metro Toronto common lease, during the period August 1, 2000 to July 31, 2005, be increased by the rate of inflation as calculated by Statistics Canada for the Toronto area for the previous calendar year;
- (2) the City of Toronto reconfirm its commitment to the use of Parks and Recreation lands for boating facilities on a lease basis;
- (3) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be authorized to negotiate a renewal of the existing boat club leases for a twenty-year period to commence August 1, 2005, with the terms of the lease subject to the approval of Council;
- (4) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism consult with the Waterfront Revitalization Task Force, T-O Bid and other relevant groups with regard to the boat club lease renewal; and
- (5) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

- (1) the Community Festivals and Special Events Grants allocations for 31 organizations totalling \$114,550.00, as listed in Attachments Nos. 1 and 3, and described in Attachments Nos. 2 and 4, be approved;
- (2) any applicant wanting to appeal its recommendations be allowed to make a deputation at the Economic Development and Parks Committee on June 19, 2000; and
- (3) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

Seeking approval for the 2000 grant allocations for the Economic Development Sector Initiatives Program (EDSIP), as well as the related Economic Sponsorship Initiatives (ESI); discussing the principals and evaluation criteria applied to select grant recipients; summarizing the grant requests and making recommendations concerning the allocations; and recommending that:

- (1) Economic Development Sector Initiatives Program grants totalling \$258,600.00 be allocated to 17 projects, as set out in Attachment No. 1;
- (2) Economic Sponsorship Initiatives grants totalling \$136,000.00 be allocated to five projects, as set out in Attachment No. 1;

- (3) the \$36,000.00 in funding previously approved for the Toronto Biotechnology Commercialization Centre by Council be released;
- (4) the disbursement of the Economic Development Sector Initiatives Program and Economic Sponsorship Initiatives allocations be conditional on satisfying the 2000 Economic Development Sector Initiatives Program goals and criteria as set out in Attachment No. 4 and on project specific conditions set out in Attachment Nos. 2 and 3; and

- (2) the balance of the 2000 grant instalments to the Art Gallery of Ontario, the Canadian Opera Company, the National Ballet of Canada and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra be made as one payment, following adoption of the allocations by Council and that monthly grant instalments to these organizations resume in January 2001;
- (3) a conditional cultural grant to the Caribbean Cultural Committee (Caribana) in the amount of \$353,500.00 be approved subject to the organization meeting the following outstanding grant conditions from 1998 and 1999 to the satisfaction of the Commissioner Economic Development, Culture and Tourism:
 - (a) the Caribbean Cultural Committee have an interim Chief Executive Officer in place to provide professional management of the Caribana Festival; and

- (b) the Caribbean Cultural Committee commit to implementing a plan to restructure the organization in order to ensure the future stability of the Caribana Festival; and
- (4) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

Requesting approval to increase the 2000 Capital Budget sub-project account for the Mondeo Park development by \$24,517.98 at net zero cost to the City; and recommending that:

- (2)expenditures and revenues in the Parks and Recreation 2000 Capital Budget -Mondeo Park Development (SAP capital account CPR103-14) be increased by \$24,517.98 and be applied to finishing grading and sodding of the site;

Reporting on the results of Request for Proposal No. 3918-00-5118 for the construction of an enclosure for the outdoor ice rink at the East Toronto Athletic Field, and the operation of the facility on a year round basis; and recommending that:

- (1)staff be authorized to negotiate and enter into a suitable agreement, in a form acceptable to the City Solicitor and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, with Air Athletics Inc. for the construction and operation of an enclosure for the ice rink at East Toronto Athletic Field as per the proposal submitted by Air Athletics Inc. in response to Request for Proposals No. 3918-00-5118;
- (2)the agreement between Air Athletic Inc. and the City of Toronto be contingent upon Air Athletics Inc. negotiating a suitable agreement with the Ted Reeve Community Arena Board of Management for shared use of equipment, staff, utilities and other costs: and
- (3) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

14. LEASE OF THE PALAIS ROYALE -**REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS NO. P-129-99.RFP** (High Park)

- (1)the proposal received from Shoreline Entertainment Corporation, the only acceptable proponent, in response to Request for Proposals No. P-129-99.RFP, for the lease of the Palais Royale, be accepted;
- (2)staff be authorized to negotiate and execute a lease agreement, in a form acceptable to the City Solicitor, with Shoreline Entertainment Corporation; and
- (3) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

TTC WITT AND PCC STREET CARS – INCLUSION 15. IN THE CITY OF TORONTO INVENTORY OF HERITAGE PROPERTIES

Requesting that Council recognize the symbolic and historical significance of the TTC's remaining Witt and PCC streetcars; and recommending that:

- (1)Council declare Witt car 2766 and PCC cars 4500 and 4549 to be symbols of the City and important objects to be preserved in their historic livery;
- Council include Witt car 2766 and PCC cars 4500 and 4549 in the City of (2)Toronto Inventory of Heritage Properties; and
- the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary (3) action to give effect thereto.

16. **TRANSFER OF THE 90 MILLIMETER ANTI-AIRCRAFT GUN AT CORONATION PARK**

Requesting permission from Toronto City Council to donate the 90 millimeter anti-aircraft gun at Coronation Park to the Bunker Military Museum in Cobalt, Ontario; and recommending that the 90 millimeter anti-aircraft gun at Coronation Park be donated to the Bunker Military Museum in Cobalt, Ontario with the restriction that the Bunker Military Museum, should it decide to deaccession the gun, keep it in the public domain by offering it to the City of Toronto in the first instance, then to an appropriate Canadian museum.

17. AGREEMENTS TO LEND ARTIFACTS FROM THE RESERVE MUSEUM COLLECTION FOR PUBLIC DISPLAY (Downtown)

Requesting Council's approval to proceed with four proposed loans of artifacts from the reserve collections for public display, and recommending that:

- (1) staff of Museums and Heritage Services, Culture Division, be authorized to negotiate and enter into a suitable agreement with the following organizations to permit the public display of artifacts from our reserve collection:
 - (a) Steam Whistle Brewing Company for the loan and display of seven steam whistles;
 - (b) The Stephen Leacock Memorial Home for the loan and display of a steam whistle and two small watercraft;
 - (c) The Royal Ontario Museum for the loan and display of 20 ephemera artifacts relating to electricity in Ontario; and
 - (d) The London and Regional Historical and Art Museums for the loan and display of a watercolour from the J.G. Howard Collection; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

18. POET LAUREATE FOR THE CITY OF TORONTO (All Wards)

Responding to a request that the Culture Division of the Economic Development, Culture and Tourism Department report to the Economic Development and Parks Committee regarding the selection of a Poet Laureate for the City of Toronto; and recommending that:

- (1) the Culture Division, in partnership with the League of Canadian Poets and other community stakeholders, determine a process for selecting and appointing a Poet Laureate for the City of Toronto by:
 - (a) establishing the roles and responsibilities of such an appointment;

- (b) establishing the length of the candidate's term;
- (c) developing a process for selecting and appointing a Poet Laureate;
- (d) investigating possible funding opportunities available through corporate sponsorships and grant programs with a view to providing an honorarium to the appointed candidate and raising the profile of the Poet Laureate program;
- (e) examining the possibility of having more than one individual serve as Poet Laureate;
- (f) examining any possible financial implications to ensure there is no financial impact on the City of Toronto; and
- (g) investigating existing Poet Laureate programs at the municipal, provincial, federal and international levels, in order to advise City Council of the process and requirements involved in establishing such an appointment.
- (2) contingent upon approval by City Council, Culture Division staff will develop a plan for selecting and appointing a Poet Laureate for the City of Toronto, by September 30, 2000, to be implemented in January of 2001.
