1. WOODBINE PARK - SPONSORSHIP OF FESTIVAL GREEN BANDSHELL - SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT (East Toronto)

(DEFERRED FROM APRIL 17, 2000 MEETING - DEPUTATION ITEM)

Providing further information as requested by the Economic Development and Parks Committee (the "EDPC") at its meeting of March 20 and 27, 2000, on the outcome of the Request For Proposals for Sponsorship Opportunities at the new Woodbine Park which closed October 6, 1999, and was held pursuant to the recommendations of City Council at its meeting of July 6, 7, 8, 1999; and recommending that:

- the basis for a sponsorship agreement with the Labatt Sponsorship Group (LSG) as sponsors for the Woodbine Park Festival Green Bandshell Park Element No.
 1 pursuant to the Request For Proposals for Woodbine Park Sponsorship and Gift Funding Entitlements dated September 1999, comprise the following:
 - (a) the sponsorship payments by the LSG to the City of Toronto for the Woodbine Park Festival Green Bandshell total \$1,000,000.00 and comprise one up-front payment of \$650,000.00 and ten annual payments of \$35,000.00 per year starting January 1, 2001, and that financial security respecting the above sponsorship payments by the LSG be provided to and in a form satisfactory to the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer; and
 - (b) the sponsorship entitlements to the Labatt Sponsorship Group (LSG) by the City comprise:
 - a sponsorship term of ten years, with an option to renew for a further five years, subject to further satisfactory arrangements being negotiated with the City;
 - (ii) naming rights to the bandshell for the length of the sponsorship term;
 - (iii) preferred brewer status and catering rights in the pizza category at up to five major events currently located at the Kew Gardens and Ashbridge's Bay Park and to be relocated and permitted on an annual basis at the new Woodbine Park, i.e. the Victoria Day Concert, the two events permitted to the Beaches Lions Club (Canada Day and Labour Day) and two events permitted to Senior Link (e.g. arts and craft shows), for the length of the sponsorship term;

- (iv) signage recognizing the contribution of the LSG in proximity to:
 - (a) the bandshell; and
 - (b) the Lakeshore/Coxwell intersection; and
- (v) consultation respecting the opening event;

all of which shall be satisfactory to and/or subject to approval by the Commissioner of Economic Development Culture and Tourism ("The Commissioner") in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer ("The C.F.O.") and the City Solicitor;

- (2) the Labatt Sponsorship Group (LSG) be requested to provide written confirmation of their agreement with the terms and conditions set out in Recommendation No. (1) above to the Commissioner by July 19, 2000, and the Commissioner be requested to report directly to City Council at its meeting of August 1, 2 and 3, 2000, on the response from the LSG and with recommendations for action by City Council to bring to a close the Request For Proposals and any necessary further recommendations;
- (3) to bring the RFP for the Festival Green Bandshell at Woodbine Park to a close, City Council, at its meeting of August 1, 2 and 3, 2000, be requested to:
 - (a) authorize the Commissioner to prepare and execute a sponsorship agreement with LSG and to accept funds and financial security from LSG generally in accordance with the terms and conditions described above, by September 1, 2000, in consultation with and on such terms and conditions as considered necessary and appropriate by the Commissioner, the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer and the City Solicitor;
 - (b) authorize an increase in the Parks and Recreation 2000 Capital Budget of \$200,000.00 net and \$1,200,000.00 gross with \$1,000,000.00 to be recovered from the LSG sponsorship funding, as set out in Recommendation No. (1); and
 - (c) authorize the Commissioner to carry out the construction of the Festival Green Bandshell at Woodbine Park and related park work (including park elements deferred by the expenditure of 1999/2000 capital funds on in-ground infrastructure for the Festival Green Bandshell as previously authorized) pursuant to the construction contract between EMM Financial Corp. and the City of Toronto, for completion date of May 1, 2001;

- (4) upon City Council approval of the above and signed completion of a contract with the LSG, the Commissioner be requested to provide written notification to current permit holders for major events at Kew Gardens and Ashbridge's Bay Park that permits will be issued for the Woodbine Park Festival Green Bandshell in place of permits issued for Kew Gardens and Ashbridge's Bay Park, for the summer 2001, under the duly delegated authority, and subject to terms and conditions established by the Commissioner;
- (5) this report be forwarded to the Policy and Finance Committee for consideration and to City Council for its meeting on August 1, 2 and 3, 2000; and
- (6) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary actions to give effect thereto.
- Note: This report supersedes the March 14, 2000, staff report and recommendations to the Economic Development and Parks Committee entitled "Sponsorship of Festival Green Bandshell"; and further the June 12, 2000, proposal from the LSG supercedes the March 10, 2000, proposal which was described in the March 14, 2000, report.

3. CITY OF TORONTO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY (All Wards)

Presenting the Economic Development Strategy for the City of Toronto as a framework for future action to support Toronto's economic prosperity and long term fiscal competitiveness; that this strategy is not a plan for the City of Toronto alone; that it is a document that suggests strategic directions and areas of action which can be the focus of attention, support and involvement by the broader Toronto community; and recommending that:

- (1) the strategic directions and action areas recommended in the attached summary of the Economic Development Strategy be adopted as a framework for future action and dialogue;
- (2) copies of the Economic Development Strategy, Part I: Cities Matter and Part II: Strategic Directions and Action Areas be circulated to Toronto business associations, labour organizations, academic institutions, and other orders of government for their consideration and discussion;
- (3) copies of the Economic Development Strategy, Part I: Cities Matter and Part II: Strategic Directions and Action Areas be circulated to appropriate Federal and Provincial Ministers, all MPs and MPPs in the GTA, all GTA municipalities, the GTMA and GTSB, with a request to work cooperatively to improve the quality of life and competitiveness of the entire region;

8. DESIGN EXCHANGE (DX) REQUEST TO ACCESS THE CITY'S DX RESERVE FUND AND THE ACCESS IMPROVEMENT-CITY-OWNED BUILDINGS CAPITAL ACCESSIBILITY ACCOUNT (All Wards)

Reviewing and making recommendations with respect to requests by the Board of the Design Exchange (DX) to access the reserve fund that has been established by the City to provide for capital expenditures and extraordinary repairs for the premises at 222 Bay Street (also known as 234 Bay Street), currently occupied by DX, as well as a request to access the City's Accessibility Account established by the former City of Toronto to provide barrier free access to City premises; and recommending that:

- (1) Council authorize a draw of up to \$50,000.00 from the Design Exchange reserve fund held by the City to provide for capital expenditures and extraordinary repairs for the DX building, and that these funds be used for replacing the existing Trading Floor lighting fixtures with a new energy-efficient lighting system, subject to:
 - (a) approvals for the proposed improvements being obtained from the landlord and the City of Toronto, as appropriate;
 - (b) DX submitting a budget for this project, including the source of funding for expenditures in excess of \$50,000.00 to the satisfaction of the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, Commissioner of Corporate Services, and the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism;
 - (c) the Commissioner of Corporate Services approving an implementation plan to include scope of work, assignment of responsibilities and costs, prepared by DX that provides the terms and conditions for the execution of the work; and
 - (d) the DX reserve fund being replenished to the \$100,000.00 level approved by former Toronto City Council, including interest, by retaining \$15,000.00 in 2001, \$15,000.00 in 2002 and \$20,000.00 in 2003, from the developer/landlord's annual contribution;
- (2) the Commissioner of Corporate Services be requested to review and evaluate the work necessary to upgrade the accessibility of the premises at 222 Bay Street (also known as 234 Bay Street), currently occupied by the Design Exchange (DX), to make it fully accessible permanently, and report to the appropriate Committee and Council no later than September 2000, on the outcome, the actions to be taken, the cost to implement the capital work, as well as any financial implications to the City;

- (3) Council request the Design Exchange to submit a capital improvements work plan establishing priorities and estimated costs for all proposed improvements not covered in Recommendations Nos. (1) and (2) above, for approval by the Commissioner of Corporate Services, prior to DX submitting future requests for capital improvements funding by the City;
- (4) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, the Commissioner of Corporate Services, and the City Solicitor be requested to commence negotiations on the terms and conditions of a new agreement to replace the current Grant Agreement with the Design Exchange, which expires on December 31, 2000, and report to Council;
- (5) this report be forwarded to Policy and Finance Committee for its consideration; and
- (6) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

9. 2000 ARTS AND CULTURE GRANT – THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL WINTER FAIR (RAWF) (Trinity Niagara)

Seeking approval for the continued grants process and funding of \$600,000.00 to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair through the 2000 Arts and Culture Grants Program; and recommending that:

- (1) a grant of \$600,000.00 be awarded to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair to assist with the rental costs of the 2000 Royal; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

10. ETOBICOKE CENTENNIAL STADIUM -CHANGE OF CAPITAL BUDGET FINANCING (Markham-Centennial)

Requesting the deferral of refurbishing the tennis courts in Centennial Park and re-directing those funds to remove asbestos in the change rooms of the Centennial Park Stadium; and recommending that:

- (1) funding of \$100,000.00 be reallocated from the tennis court refurbishment project and be used to remove asbestos in the Centennial Park Stadium;
- (2) the tennis court refurbishment project be deferred for consideration with future capital works programming;
- (3) this report be forwarded to the Policy and Finance Committee for its consideration; and
- (4) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto

11. GORD AND IRENE RISK COMMUNITY CENTRE -CHANGE OF CAPITAL PROJECT SCOPE
