Reporting on survey results on residents' interest in traffic calming on Winnett Avenue between Normanna Avenue and Hursting Avenue; advising that in response to the re-survey sent to residents of Winnett Avenue from Normanna Avenue to Hursting Avenue, only 25 or 48 percent of a total of 53 ballots sent out were received back and that there is not sufficient evidence of resident interest in proceeding with traffic calming measures at this time; and recommending that this report be received for information.
