Advising that the Economic Development and Parks Committee at its meetings held on February 16, 26 and March 2, 2001, reviewed the 2001 Capital Program for the Economic Development, Culture and Tourism Department and recommends to the Budget Advisory Committee:

(1) the adoption of the 2001 Capital Program for the following Divisions:

Culture Division:

As presented, subject to the following:

- (a) the Maintenance of Outdoor Public Art Program being reduced by 30 percent to \$124,500.00 in 2001 only;
- (b) the Market Gallery refurbishment and rehabilitation project being deferred to 2002;
- (c) the Restoration of the Morrish Store being reduced to \$175,000.00 in 2001 and the balance of \$75,000.00 be deferred for inclusion in the 2002 submission;
- (d) the Todmorden Mills Papermill Retrofit Project being reduced to \$233,000.00 with the remaining \$233,000.00 being deferred for consideration in 2002;
- (e) the Conservation and Collection Program being reduced by 50 percent to \$52,500.00; and the balance of \$52,500.00 being deferred to 2002; and
- (f) the Fort York Restoration Project being reduced to \$127,500.00 in 2001 and \$127,500.00 in 2002.

Economic Development Division:

As presented, subject to the following:

- (a) the BIA Streetscape Improvement Program being reduced by \$100,000.00;
- (b) the Employment Area Revitalization Program being reduced by \$100,000.00;
- (c) funding for the Commercial Façade Project being reinstated at \$425,000.00 for 2001, and the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism being requested to work within this funding envelope; and
- (d) the Banner and Mural sub-project being reinstated as part of the Employment Area Revitalization Project at \$25,000.00 for 2001.

Parks and Recreation Division:

- (a) the following Capital Budget Projects being reduced by 10 percent:
 - (i) Playground Rehabilitation Program (\$150,000.00);
 - (ii) Various Park Rehabilitation Programs (\$130,000.00); and

- (b) the following projects being deferred until 2002:
 - (i) Fairbank Community Centre Addition (\$550,000.00);
 - (ii) Fairfield Seniors Centre gym expansion (\$275,000.00);
 - (ii) Masaryk Cowan Community Centre Storage Cabinet and Renovations to Weight Room (\$75,000.00);
 - (iii) Agincourt Tennis Fieldhouse Painting (\$120,000.00); and
 - (iv) Ashtonbee Park Fieldhouse construction (675,000.00);
- (c) the St. Jamestown Recreation Centre Project being approved for a total project cost of \$10 million gross and net with a cash flow of \$1 million in 2001, \$6 million in 2002, and \$3 million in 2003, noting that any additional third party funding received for this project is to be submitted to the Economic Development and Parks Committee;

- (d) the \$1.962 million in the reserve account for community centres being used specifically for start up costs for the south east quadrant of the City in the vicinity of Eglinton Avenue/Black Creek for a community centre facility in 2001, subject to the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism reporting to the Budget Advisory Committee on the availability of such reserve funds for this project;
- (e) the \$150,000.00 for the East Point Park Regrade Soccer Field being reallocated to the Port Union Skateboard Park Repairs in 2001;
- (f) the Dundonald Parkette renovation being added to the 2001 budget of \$300,000.00 gross and zero net;
- (g) the Murison Park Relocation Project being accelerated from 2003 to 2001 in the amount of \$369,000.00; and
- (h) consideration being given to accelerating the Martin Goodman Trail Maintenance Sub-Project to 2002.
