CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF JANUARY 8, 2001 MEETING.

1. DEVELOPMENT CHARGES – REFUND PROGRAM FOR FIRST-TIME HOME BUYERS CITY-WIDE

<u>Commissioner of Urban Development Services</u> (January 3, 2001)

**Reporting** on a request for a program to refund development charges to first time home buyers and **recommending** that Council not pursue a program to provide first-time home buyers with a grant equivalent to development charges.

# 2. PROPOSED PROVINCIAL MEASURES TO AUGMENT AND SUPPORT MUNICIPAL EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN SAFE COMMUNITIES AND TO DEAL WITH PROBLEM ADDRESSES

<u>Commissioner, Urban Development Services</u> (January 17, 2001)

**Reporting** on suggested new measures that, if implemented by the Province of Ontario, would enable Urban Development Services to more effectively take enforcement action against problem addresses and thereby enhance the safety of communities, and **recommending** that:

- (1) the Planning and Transportation Committee approve the suggested measures (contained in the Appendix to this staff report);
- (2) the Planning and Transportation Committee commend the measures to Council with recommendations that:
  - (i) Council petition the Government of Ontario to consider their implementation, and:
  - (ii) Council encourage all Greater Toronto Area Councils to review and endorse its petition to the Government of Ontario; and
- (3) the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

## 2(a) <u>City Clerk</u> (September 14, 2000)

**Forwarding** the action taken by Community Services Committee at its meeting on September 14, 2000, and **referring** the communication (August 11, 2000) from the City Clerk advising that City Council on August 1, 2, 3 and 4, 2000, struck out and referred back the following Recommendation (c) of the Community Services Committee for further consideration and report thereon to the meeting of Council scheduled to be held on October 3, 2000, to the Planning and Transportation Committee for consideration with the forthcoming report on a multi-disciplinary approach to neighbourhood decay:

"(c) that City Council be requested to resubmit to the Province of Ontario for consideration and implementation the suggestions prepared by the Municipal Licensing and Standards Division for provincial measures to strengthen municipal efforts to maintain safe communities and to deal with problem addresses, which were originally presented at a meeting co-ordinated by the Province on March 14, 2000, on Integrated Enforcement."
