Responding to Community Council's request for further information to summarize and review the economic physical and taxation issues related to the construction of an underpass/overpass on the captioned area.

3. REMOVAL OF ONE PRIVATELY-OWNED TREE 112 HOMESTEAD ROAD (Ward 44 – Scarborough East)

Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism (May 8, 2002)

Recommending that Scarborough Community Council:

- (1) approve the request for the removal of one privately-owned tree located at 112 Homestead Road conditional on:
 - (a) the tree in question not being removed until permitted construction activities, in accordance with plans approved under the building permit application for the site, commence, which warrant the destruction of the tree; and
 - (b) the applicant agreeing to implement the planting of two large growing trees on the subject site in accordance with the plan on file with the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism;

- (2) deny the request for the removal of one privately-owned tree at 112 Homestead Road.

- (2) the appropriate by-law be amended accordingly.

5. MINOR STREET STOP SIGN ON ROSEMOUNT DRIVE (Ward 37 – Scarborough Centre)

Director of Transportation Services, District 4 (May 16, 2002)

Recommending that:

- (1) stop sign regulation on Rosemount Drive, as identified in Appendix 1 of this report, be adopted; and
- (2) the appropriate by-laws be amended accordingly.

6. MINOR STREET STOP SIGNS ON SANWOOD BOULEVARD (Ward 39 – Scarborough Agincourt)

Director of Transportation Services, District 4 (May 16, 2002)

Recommending that:

- (1) the stop sign regulations on two roads intersecting Sanwood Boulevard, as identified in Appendix 1 of this report, be rescinded;
- (2) the through street regulation on Sanwood Boulevard, as identified in Appendix 2 of this report, be adopted for the installation of stop signs on all roads intersecting Sanwood Boulevard between Birchmount Road and Purcell Square; and
- (3) the appropriate by-laws be amended accordingly.

7. ALL-WAY STOP CONTROL CANONGATE TRAIL AND ELMFIELD CRESCENT, SOUTH INTERSECTION (Ward 39 – Scarborough Agincourt)

8. PROPOSED SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION ON SATOK TERRACE AND PROPOSED STOP SIGN ON CATHLO STREET AT SATOK TERRACE (Ward 44 – Scarborough East)

Director of Transportation Services, District 4 (May 17, 2002)

Recommending that:

- (1) the 40 kilometre per hour speed limit on Satok Terrace, as identified in Appendix 1 of this report, be adopted;
- (2) an all-way stop control not be installed at the intersection of Satok Terrace and Cathlo Street;
- (3) the stop sign on Cathlo Street, as identified in Appendix 2 of this report, be adopted; and
- (4) the appropriate by-laws be amended accordingly.
