On motion by Councillor Flint, the Minutes of the meeting of the Midtown Community Council held on April 2, 2002, were confirmed.

4.1 Public Hearing Pursuant to the Municipal Act Draft By-law - Everden Road from Ava Road to Eglinton Avenue West - Installation of Speed Humps. (St. Paul's - Ward 21)

At this point in the proceedings, the Midtown Community Council held a Statutory Public Hearing in accordance with the Municipal Act and notice with respect to the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was advertised in a daily newspaper on April 18, April 22, 29 and May 6, 2002.

The Midtown Community Council had before it a Draft By-law submitted by the City Solicitor, respecting the alteration of Everden Road between Ava Road and Eglinton Avenue West by the installation of speed humps.

of Millwood Road residents and advising that conditions for the installation of speed humps on the subject section of Millwood Road have been satisfied; further advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the receipt of this report; and recommending that this report be received for information.

(Eglinton-Lawrence - Ward 16)

At this point in the proceedings, the Midtown Community Council held a Statutory Public Hearing in accordance with the Municipal Act and notice with respect to the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was advertised in a daily newspaper on April 18, April 22, 29 and May 6, 2002.

The Midtown Community Council had before it a Draft By-law submitted by the City Solicitor, respecting the alteration of Hillhurst Boulevard between Avenue Road and Mona Drive by the installation of speed humps.

The Midtown Community Council also had before it a report (April 23, 2002) from the Director, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on the results of a speed hump poll of residents of Hillhurst Boulevard, between Avenue Road and Mona Drive; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and recommending that the draft by-law to alter the section of Hillhurst Boulevard, between Avenue Road and Mona Drive, by means of the installation of speed humps, not be enacted in light of the poll results, which did not achieve the 60 percent support level as stipulated in the Speed Hump Policy adopted by the Council of the former City of Toronto.

4.7 Application for Curblane Vending Permit Mount Pleasant Road - East Side 15.1 Metres
North of Roehampton Avenue.
(St. Paul's - Ward 22)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 23, 2002) from the Acting Manager, Municipal Licensing and Standards, reporting on an appeal of staff's refusal of a curblane vending application, which was denied because a written objection was received; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and, further, advising that the Midtown Community Council may recommend that City Council approve the application for curblane vending on Mount Pleasant Road, east side, 15.1 metres north of Roehampton Avenue.

4.8 Construction of Two Decorative Stone Pillars
- 246 Dunvegan Road.
(St. Paul's - Ward 22)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 19, 2002) from the Manager, Right of Way Management, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on a request to construct two decorative stone pillars to a height of 1.83 m and to a depth of 1.22 m below grade within the public right of way fronting 246 Dunvegan Road; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and recommending that City Council approve the construction of the pillars within the public right of way fronting 246 Dunvegan Road, subject to the owner entering into an encroachment agreement with the City of Toronto, as prescribed under Chapter 313 of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code.

Councillor Walker appointed Councillor Flint Acting Chair and vacated the Chair.

On motion by Councillor Walker, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of the foregoing report.

Councillor Walker resumed the Chair.

4.9 Maintenance of a Fence - 33 Markdale Avenue. (St. Paul's - Ward 21)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 17, 2002) from the Manager, Right of Way Management, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on the homeowner's request to maintain a wooden fence within the public right of way which exceeds the maximum height permitted under the former City of York, Municipal Code, Chapter 1004, Street; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and recommending that the maintenance of the wooden fence within the public right of way fronting 33 Markdale Avenue be approved, subject to the owner entering into an agreement with the City of Toronto.

4.10 Request for an Exemption from Chapter 248 of the Former City of Toronto Municipal Code to Permit Driveway Widening for Two Vehicles at 36 Millwood Road. (St. Paul's - Ward 22)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 22, 2002) from the Manager, Right of Way Management, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on a request for an exemption from Municipal Code Chapter 248, Parking Licences, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code, to permit driveway widening for two vehicles at 36 Millwood Road, which does not meet the requirements of the Code; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and recommending that:

(1) City Council deny the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle at 36 Millwood Road;

or

(2) City Council approve the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle at 36 Millwood Road, as shown on Appendix 'A', subject to:

- (a) the parking area for each space not exceeding 2.0 m by 5.9 m in dimension;
- (b) the applicant removing the excess paving;
- (c) the applicant planting a tree or funding the planting of a tree as requested by Urban Forestry Services;
- (d) all work being carried out in accordance with the requirements of Urban Forestry Services; and
- (e) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, Parking Licences, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code.

or

- (3) City Council approve the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle at 36 Millwood Road, as shown on Appendix 'B', notwithstanding the required landscaped space would not be provided, subject to:
 - (a) the parking area for each space not exceeding 2.6 m by 5.9 m in dimension;
 - (b) the applicant removing the excess paving;
 - (c) the applicant planting a tree or funding the planting of a tree as requested by Urban Forestry Services;
 - (d) all work being carried out in accordance with the requirements of Urban Forestry Services; and
 - (e) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, Parking Licences, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code.

Meredith Hilton appeared before the Midtown Community Council in connection with the foregoing matter.

Councillor Walker appointed Councillor Flint Acting Chair and vacated the Chair.

On motion by Councillor Walker, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of Recommendation No. 2 of the foregoing report, ie:

"that City Council approve the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle at 36 Millwood Road, as shown on Appendix 'A', subject to:

- (a) the parking area for each space not exceeding 2.0 m by 5.9 m in dimension;
- (b) the applicant removing the excess paving;
- (c) the applicant planting a tree or funding the planting of a tree as requested by Urban Forestry Services;
- (d) all work being carried out in accordance with the requirements of Urban Forestry Services; and
- (e) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, Parking Licences, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code."

4.11 Implementation of Area Based
Permit Parking in Wards 17 and 21.
(St. Paul's - Ward 21 and Davenport - Ward 17)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 23, 2002) from the Manager, Right of Way Management, Transportation Services, District 1, addressed to

Humber York and Midtown Community Councils, reporting on the establishment of Area Based Permit Parking in Wards 17 and 21; advising that funds to undertake the necessary signage adjustments/installation in the estimated amount of \$2,500.00 have been provided in the Transportation Services Division 2002 Operating Budget; and recommending that:

- (1) permit parking By-law No. 3491-80 of the former City of York be amended to incorporate new permit parking areas as shown in attached Appendix 'A' of this report; and
- (2) the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

On motion by Councillor Mihevc, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of the report; and, further, that Transportation Services staff be requested to report to the Midtown Community Council on:

- (a) the feasibility of implementing area based permit parking on following streets: Valewood Avenue; Maplewood Avenue (east Wychwood Avenue Raglan to Avenue): Dundurn Crescent (between Winona Drive and Atlas Avenue); and Graham Gardens; and
- (b) the feasibility of introducing an area based permit parking system in the communities of York and Toronto east of Bathurst Street (including Lonsdale Road, Lonsmount Drive, Tichester Road, Walmer Road, Heath Street, and Tweedsmuir Avenue.)

4.12 Request for an Exemption from Chapter 248
of the Former City of Toronto Municipal
Code to Permit Driveway Widening at 282 Erskine Avenue.
(Don Valley West - Ward 25)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 19, 2002) from the Manager, Right of Way Management, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on a request for an exemption from Municipal Code Chapter 248, Parking Licences, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code, to permit driveway widening for two vehicles at 282 Erskine Avenue, which does not meet the requirements of the Code; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and recommending that:

(1) City Council deny the application for driveway widening for two vehicles at 282 Erskine Avenue.

or

- (2) City Council approve the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle at 282 Erskine Avenue, as shown on Appendix 'A', subject to:
 - (a) the parking area for each space not exceeding 2.1 m by 5.9 m in dimension;
 - (b) the applicant removing the excess paving; and
 - (c) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code.

or

- (3) City Council approve the application for driveway widening for a second vehicle, one of which is to be angled, at 282 Erskine Avenue, as shown on Appendix 'B', subject to:
 - (a) the parking area for the parking space within the limits of the driveway not exceeding 2.1 m by 5.9 m in dimension and for the parking space adjacent to the driveway not exceeding 2.0 m by 4.8 m in dimension; and
 - (b) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code.

On motion by Councillor Flint, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of Recommendation No. 2 of the foregoing report, as amended, by deleting the words "Appendix 'A' " and inserting "Appendix 'C' ", so that such Recommendation now reads:

- (a) the parking area for each space not exceeding 2.1 m by 5.9 m in dimension;
- (b) the applicant removing the excess paving; and
- (c) the applicant paying all applicable fees and complying with all other criteria set out in Municipal Code Chapter 248, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code."

4.13 Installation of On-Street Parking Spaces for Persons with Disabilities. (Eglinton-Lawrence - Ward 16 and St. Paul's - Ward 21)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 19, 2002) from the Director, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on the installation of on-street disabled persons' parking spaces; advising that funds to undertake the necessary signage adjustments in the estimated amount of \$600.00 are contained in the Transportation

Services Division 2002 Operating Budget; and recommending that:

- (1) the installation of on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities, as noted in Table "A" of this report, be approved; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be requested to take any action necessary to give effect to the foregoing, including the introduction in Council of any Bills that may be required.

On motion by Councillor Mihevc, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of the foregoing report.

4.14 Eglinton Avenue East - South Side Between Dunfield Avenue and Lillian Street Fronting Premises No. 101 Eglinton Avenue East
(York Event Theatres) - Provision of an On-Street
Loading Zone for Disabled and Other Persons.
(St. Paul's - Ward 22)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 22, 2002) from the Director, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on keeping the area fronting Premises No. 101 Eglinton Avenue East clear of parking vehicles to enhance pick-up/drop-off opportunities for disabled and other persons using the York Event Theatre; advising that funds to undertake the necessary signage adjustments in the estimated amount of \$500.00 are contained in the Transportation Services Division 2002 Operating Budget; and recommending that:

- (1) standing be prohibited on the south side of Eglinton Avenue East, from a point 51 metres east of Dunfield Avenue to a point ten metres further east; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take whatever action is necessary to implement the foregoing, including the introduction in Council of any bills that are required.

Councillor Walker appointed Councillor Flint Acting Chair and vacated the Chair.

On motion by Councillor Walker, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of the foregoing report.

Councillor Walker resumed the Chair.

4.15 Poll Results - North Leaside Amendments to Parking Regulations.
(Don Valley West - Ward 26)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 18, 2002) from the City Clerk, reporting on the results of a traffic poll conducted on several roadways within the North Leaside neighbourhood regarding parking regulation amendments in order to deter non-resident daytime parking; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the receipt of this report; and recommending that the report be received for information.

4.16 Poll Results - Implementation of "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" Regulation on the North Side of Field Avenue Between Bessborough Drive and Hanna Road.

(Don Valley West - Ward 26)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 19, 2002) from the City Clerk, reporting on the results of a poll conducted on Field Avenue between Bessborough Drive and Hanna Road regarding the implementation of "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" regulation on the north side of Field Avenue, between Bessborough Drive and Hanna Road; advising that funds in the amount of \$500.00 associated with the installation of appropriate signs are contained in the Transportation Services Division 2002 Operating Budget interim appropriations; and recommending that Midtown Community Council consider the poll results and determine whether or not to implement "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" regulation on the north side of Field Avenue, between Bessborough Drive and Hanna Road.

The Midtown Community Council also had before it a communication (May 1, 2002) from Shelagh Deike and Dennis Warenycia, in support of "No Parking" implementation.

On motion by Councillor Pitfield, the Community Midtown Council recommended to Council implementation of a "No Parking 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" regulation on the north side of Field Avenue, between Bessborough Drive and Hanna Road and that the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto, including the introduction of the necessary Bills in Council.

4.17 Chaplin Crescent - Both Sides Between Yonge Street and Duplex Avenue Implementation of a "No Stopping Anytime " Prohibition.
(St. Paul's - Ward 22)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 18, 2002) from the Director, Transportation Services, District 1, reporting on deterring incidences of illegal parking, reducing traffic congestion on Chaplin Crescent, west of Yonge Street and enhancing the access of TTC bus drivers when entering/exiting the Davisville Bus

Station; advising that funds in the estimated amount of \$400.00 to fabricate and install the appropriate signage are available in the Transportation Services Division 2002 Operating Budget; and recommending that:

- a "No Stopping Anytime" prohibition be implemented on both sides of Chaplin Crescent, from Yonge Street to Duplex Avenue; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be requested to take whatever action is necessary to give effect to the foregoing, including the introduction in Council of any Bills that may be required.

Councillor Walker appointed Councillor Flint Acting Chair and vacated the Chair.

On motion by Councillor Walker, the Midtown Community Council recommended to Council adoption of the foregoing report.

Councillor Walker resumed the Chair.

4.18 Divadale Drive Between Sutherland Drive and Laird Drive - Amendments to Parking Regulations. (Don Valley West - Ward 26)

The Midtown Community Council had before it a report (April 17, 2002) from the Director, Transportation Services, District 1, recommending parking regulation amendments on Divadale Drive between Sutherland Drive and Laird Drive, to mitigate concerns regarding non-resident parking; advising that funds in the amount of \$1,000.00 associated with the installation of appropriate signs are contained in the Transportation Services 2002 Operating Budget; and recommending that:

- a "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, except public holidays" regulation be enacted on the north side of Divadale Drive between Sutherland Drive and Laird Drive, subject to the favourable results of polling of the affected residents, conducted according to the policy of the former Borough of East York;
