Confirmation of Minutes

On a motion by Councillor Ashton, the Minutes of the meeting of the Scarborough Community Council held on May 7 and the Special Meeting held on May 21, 2002, were confirmed.

**6.1 Fire Station No. 1, 351 Birchmount Road
(Ward 36 – Scarborough Southwest)**

The Community Council had before it a report (May 16, 2002) from the Chief, Fire Services, responding to a direction by the Community Services Committee and the Budget Advisory Committee that the Fire Chief consult with the Members of the Scarborough Community Council as to the future use of the old Scarborough Fire Station No. 1, and report thereon to the Administration Committee.

- A. Councillor Duguid moved that the Scarborough Community Council advise the Administration Committee that the Community Council endorses the use of Fire Station No. 1, 351 Birchmount Road, by Toronto Fire Services, Fire Prevention staff, and recommends:
- (1) that space be made available for the restoration and storage of historical Fire Department-related artifacts and equipment; and
 - (2) that Council continue to support this location as a future museum and education centre to preserve local Fire Department history.

- B. Councillor Ashton moved that the Commissioner of Corporate Services be requested to:
- (1) remove 351 Birchmount Road from the property disposition list and report to Administration Committee under which jurisdiction the property should remain, pending further consideration;
 - (2) report on the short-term maintenance of the facility and appropriate resource allocations; and further
 - (3) that the Administration Committee be requested to consult with interested stakeholders regarding a future plan for 351 Birchmount Road.

**6.2 Steeles Avenue East/CN Rail Grade Separation
Near Kennedy Road – Review of Findings of
Class Environmental Assessment
(Ward 39 – Scarborough Agincourt)**

The Community Council had before it the following reports:

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(May 24, 2002) joint report from the Director of Transportation Infrastructure Management, and the Director of Transportation Services, District 4, responding to a request from the Scarborough Community Council at its meeting of April 2, 2002, for a further report on the life-cycle cost comparisons of constructing an underpass versus constructing an overpass at the Steeles Avenue East/GO Transit crossing, and recommending that this report be received for information;

(March 25, 2002) joint report from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, the Director of Community Planning, East District, and the Acting Director of Transportation Infrastructure Management, responding to Community Council's request for further information, summarizing and reviewing the economic and taxation issues related to the construction of an underpass versus an overpass; and

(October 27, 2001) from the City Clerk (Works Committee), advising that the Works Committee, at its meeting on October 17, 2001, referred the report (October 3, 2001) from the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services respecting the review of the 1994 Steeles Avenue East/CN Rail Grade Separation Class Environmental Assessment, to the Scarborough Community Council for consideration of the business impact of the grade separation, with a request that staff of the Economic Development, Culture and Tourism Department be in attendance at that time.

A. Councillor Balkissoon moved that the Works Committee be advised that the Scarborough Community Council's preference for any future construction for the Steeles Avenue East/CN Rail Grade Separation be the underpass design, having regard for the findings summarized in the joint reports, dated March 25 and May 24, 2002, which refer to the economic development impact on the surrounding area and the life-cycle cost impact of the two options.

(1) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism be requested to report to the Works Committee, at its meeting on June 25, 2002, on the economic impact of taking no action or deferring a grade separation; and

(2) the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services be requested to update the Works Committee at its meeting on June 25, 2002, on the potential injurious affection impact of an underpass versus an overpass.

C. Councillor Kelly moved that the Scarborough Community Council recommend to Works Committee that this matter be deferred sine die.

**6.3 Removal of one Privately-Owned Tree
112 Homestead Road
(Ward 44 – Scarborough East)**

The Community Council had before it a report (May 8, 2002) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, recommending that Scarborough Community Council:

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- (1) approve the request for the removal of one privately-owned tree located at 112 Homestead Road conditional on:
 - (a) the tree in question not being removed until permitted construction activities, in accordance with plans approved under the building permit application for the site, commence, which warrant the destruction of the tree; and
 - (b) the applicant agreeing to implement the planting of two large growing trees on the subject site in accordance with the plan on file with the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism;

OR

- (2) deny the request for the removal of one privately-owned tree at 112 Homestead Road.

- (1) an all-way stop control be installed at the south intersection of Canongate Trail and Elmfield Crescent;
- (2) the speed limit on Elmfield Crescent be reduced to 40 kilometres per hour; and
- (3) the appropriate by-laws be amended accordingly.

- (1) the 40 kilometre per hour speed limit on Satok Terrace, as identified in Appendix 1 of this report, be adopted;

- (3) the stop sign on Cathlo Street, as identified in Appendix 2 of this report, be adopted; and
- (4) the appropriate by-laws be amended accordingly.

6.20 Scarborough Canada Day Parade

The Scarborough Community Council agreed to consider the following motion by Councillor Duguid as an added matter to its Agenda.

“WHEREAS the Scarborough Canada Day Parade has been a 35-year tradition enjoyed and celebrated by Scarborough residents of all ages;

WHEREAS the Scarborough Canada Day Parade was at one time the largest Canada Day Parade in all of Canada;

WHEREAS Scarborough Community Council Members were advised last week of the City's intention to cancel the 2002 Scarborough Canada Day Parade due to low registration of participants in this year's parade;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Scarborough Community Council support the continuation of the Scarborough Canada Day Parade in 2002 and into the future;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Scarborough Community Council request the Commissioner of Economic Development and Parks to provide the resources required to generate greater participation in the Scarborough Canada Day Parade;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a “Save the Scarborough Canada Day Parade Committee” be formed including interested Members of Scarborough Community Council, community members, and businesses to work with City staff, to ensure that the 2002 Canada Day Parade takes place and that efforts be made to increase interest and participation in subsequent years’ events.”

The Scarborough Community Council approved the aforementioned motion by Councillor Duguid, having regard for the advice given by the Director of Parks and Recreation, East District, that sufficient resources are available within the East District to accommodate this request.
