DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST PURSUANT TO THE MUNICIPAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST ACT.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES – January 27, 2003 [Sent to Members by electronic mail]

1. TORONTO'S ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE (ETS) BY-LAW – DESIGNATED SMOKING ROOMS.

Medical Officer of Health (February 17, 2003)

Reporting back, as requested, on options to phase-out or otherwise amend the exemption to allow Designated Smoking Rooms (DSRs) in Toronto's ETS By-law; advising there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and **recommending** that the Board of Health receive this report for information.

1(a). <u>Chair, Toronto Cancer Prevention Coalition</u> (February 18, 2003)

Expressing support for Toronto's No Smoking By-law and planned phase out of Designated Smoking Rooms.

2. THE COST OF THE NUTRITIOUS FOOD BASKET IN TORONTO.

Medical Officer of Health (February 10, 2003)

- (2) Toronto Public Health provide information on the Cost of Nutritious Food Basket to community-based agencies in Toronto that provide food/nutrition programs and services in low income communities; and
- (3) the appropriate city officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

3. PUBLIC HEALTH CONSULTATION ON GENETICALLY ENGINEERED FOODS.

Medical Officer of Health (February 17, 2003)

Reporting on the Public Health stakeholder consultation on Genetically Engineered Foods; advising that there are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report; and **recommending** that:

- (1) the Board of Health endorse the Ontario Public Health Association (OPHA) position paper on food biotechnology titled "Protecting our Food Supply: Public Health Implications of Food Biotechnology" (Appendix 1);
- (2) the Board of Health communicate its support for the OPHA recommendations (Appendix 2) to the Federal Minister of Health.
- (3) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

4. FOOD IRRADIATION.
