2. 2004 Recreation Grants Program - Recommendations (All Wards)

(Deputation)

Report (May 17, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, presenting the recommended grant allocations for all community organizations that have applied for municipal support in the Recreation Grants Program for 2004.

Recommendations:

- (1) Minor Recreation Grant allocations totalling \$325,500.00 to 113 community organizations listed in Attachment No. 1 and described in Attachment No. 4 be approved;

 - (3) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

7. 2004 Arts and Culture Grants Recommendations Local Arts Service Organizations (All Wards)

(Deputation)

Report (May 17, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, presenting the recommended grant allocations for the four organizations that have applied for municipal support within the Local Arts Service Organizations (LASOs) category of the Arts and Culture Grants Program.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that:

(1) Arts and Culture Grants allocations totalling \$305,200.00 to four Local Arts Service Organizations (LASOs) be approved as follows:

Arts Etobicoke \$155,000.00; Lakeshore Arts 33,200.00; Scarborough Arts Council 77,000.00; urbanArts Community Arts Council 40,000.00; and

(2) the appropriate City officials be authorized to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

8. Pilot Project for Twenty-five Information Pillars Request for Proposal No. 3012-03-7369

(Presentation)

Joint report (May 13, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, advising on the results of Request for Proposal (RFP) No. 3012-03-7369 for the design, provision, installation, and maintenance of twenty-five Information Pillars for the Parks and Recreation Division, Economic Development, Culture and Tourism Department, and to obtain authorization to negotiate and enter into an agreement with the recommended proponent, Astral Media Outdoor L.P. for a term of up to five years as a pilot project initiative.

Recommendations:

- (1) Astral Media Outdoor L.P., the highest overall scoring proponent meeting the requirements, and their "Streetsmart 100 series" as the preferred design, be selected to provide for the design, provision, installation, and maintenance of twenty-five (25) Information Pillars for the pilot project initiative;
- (2) authority be given to the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, and the City Solicitor to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Astral Media Outdoor L.P. to provide for the design, provision, siting, installation, and maintenance of twenty-five Information Pillars for a term of up to five years as a pilot project initiative in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the RFP, and in a form and content acceptable to the City Solicitor;
- (3) staff conduct an evaluation in 2007, and submit a report to Council with recommendations on whether the project should be continued, expanded or terminated at the end of the contract period;
- (4) provided that there is a favourable review in accordance with Recommendation No. 3, and Council decides not to pursue a revised comprehensive street furniture program in 2009, and Council authorizes the continuation or expansion of the project, Astral Media Outdoor L.P. be granted the option of first right of refusal to extend the agreement for a further five years, excluding portions of land on the public rights-of-way, in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the RFP;
- (5) the appropriate City officials be authorized to issue a permit for erecting information pillar(s) in Nathan Phillips Square, and in accordance with the Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 237, Article II;
- (6) this report be forwarded to the Policy and Finance Committee for consideration;

- (7) any revenue increase arising from implementation of this proposal be reported to the Budget Advisory Committee for consideration with the Parks and Recreation and Facilities and Real Estate 2005 Operating budgets; and
- (8) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take all actions necessary and execute all documents to give effect thereto.

9. Sole Source Purchase Orders for Environmental Improvements with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (Various Wards)

Report (May 17, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, seeking permission from Council to enter into sole source purchase orders with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) for environmental projects.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that:

- (1) staff be given permission to enter into sole source purchase order totalling \$417,000.00, including all taxes and charges, for 2004 with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA), in order to expedite and complete various approved environmental capital projects; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

10. Winchester Square Capital Facilities Recreation Reserve Funds (Ward 28 Toronto Centre-Rosedale)

Joint report (May 7, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, to establish the 'Winchester Square Capital Facilities Recreation Reserve Fund' to support capital initiatives related to recreation facilities in Ward 28 Toronto Centre-Rosedale.

- (1) Council establish an obligatory reserve fund called the "Winchester Square Capital Facilities Recreation Reserve Fund" to support capital projects related to recreation facilities in the vicinity of the Winchester Square lands, located at 225 Wellesley Street East and 550 Ontario Street;
- (2) the Old Municipal Code Chapter 227 (Reserves and Reserve Funds) be amended by adding the Reserve Fund as noted in Recommendation No. 1 to Schedule B2 (Third Party Agreements Reserve Fund) or to the New Chapter 227 Schedule 10 Planning Act Reserve Fund;

- (3) this report be forwarded to Policy and Finance Committee for consideration; and
- (4) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto, and leave be granted for the introduction of any necessary bills in Council to give effect thereto.

11. The Allocation of the Usage of Two Dates Each Year Provided for in the Lease Agreement with the Royal Woodbine Golf Course (Ward 2 – Etobicoke North)

Report (May 17, 2004) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism seeking authority to allocate the usage of two dates each year provided for in the Lease Agreement with the Royal Woodbine Golf Course.

19. Heritage Property Tax Rebate Program

Communication (May 7, 2004) from the City Clerk, advising that the Toronto Preservation Board at its meeting held on May 6, 2004, recommended to the Economic Development and Parks Committee, and Council, the adoption of the following motion by Mr. Patrick Gossage, Chair:

"WHEREAS the provincial government has amended the Municipal Act to permit municipalities to offer a Heritage Property Tax Rebate Program so that owners of heritage properties may receive a property tax rebate of up to 40 percent of the taxes paid on the heritage features of their property, subject, among other things, to those property owners granting a Heritage Easement Agreement to the City; and

WHEREAS the City of Toronto has approved a report recommending such Heritage Property Tax Rebates be provided, subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS the Program has not been implemented due to the caps imposed by the provincial government on the industrial and commercial tax rates, which would require the residential taxpayers to carry 100 percent of the cost of this program; and

WHEREAS the current provincial government has partially removed the industrial and commercial tax caps for 2004 but has provided no guarantee that such relief will be continued in future years; and

WHEREAS these tax caps prevent a fair and equitable sharing of the costs of the Heritage Property Tax Rebate Program within or among the commercial, industrial and residential tax classes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Toronto Preservation Board recommends to the Economic Development and Parks Committee, and Council, that City Council request the provincial Minister of Finance to amend or remove the tax caps for the year 2005 and beyond to allow the Heritage Property Tax Rebate Program to be financed within each tax class or across all tax classes."

20. Proposed Emery Village Business Improvement Area Ontario Municipal Board Order Approving By-law 265-2003 (Ward 7 York West)
