#### **Confirmation of Minutes**

A. Councillor Kelly moved that the Toronto East Community Council request the Chief Administrative Officer to submit a report to Community Council, or the appropriate Standing Committee, on a system and cost of monitoring and analyzing the "health" of the Scarborough Community.

Councillor Del Grande moved that the organizers of the Scarborough Summit be requested to submit their presentation to the Chair and that the Chair direct their recommendations to the various Scarborough elected officials who will bring forth those recommendations to the appropriate Standing Committees, and further, that the Chair be requested to organize, with the co-operation of "Stand Up for Scarborough" and the "Scarborough Summit", a "Politicians' Summit" to include Scarborough MP's and MPP's to discuss the recommendations brought forward today.

- (4) following closure of the Highway, easements be granted to any affected utility companies, for the existing utilities plant located in the Highway, or with the consent of the said utility companies, the utilities plant be relocated, adjusted or abandoned, at the sole cost of Transmetro, with such costs to be determined by the appropriate utility companies;
- (5) the Southerly Highway be declared surplus to the City's requirements with the intended method of disposal to be by way of a long-term lease to the adjoining property owner and all steps necessary to comply with Chapter 213 of the City of Toronto Municipal Code be taken;
- (6) the Commissioner of Corporate Services be authorized to enter into negotiations for a long-term lease of the Southerly Highway with the adjoining property owner, Kraft Canada Inc. ("Kraft"), for nominal consideration;
- (7) following closure of the Highway, the Northerly Highway be placed under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, for parks purposes; and
- (8) the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto, including the introduction in Council of any bills necessary to give effect thereto.

Owners will not be refunded to the Owners unless the Surplus Highways are closed and sold to a party other than the Owners, their successors or assigns;

- (3) following Council's approval of a sale of the Surplus Highways, notice be given to the public of a proposed by-law to permanently close the Highways, in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 162 of the City of Toronto Municipal Code and, in addition, by publishing one notice of the proposed by-law in a local community newspaper, at the cost of the Owners referred to in the body of this report;
- (4) the Toronto East Community Council hear any member of the public who wishes to speak to this matter;
- (5) following closure of the Highways, easements be granted to any affected utility companies for the existing utilities plant located in the Highways or, with respect to the Surplus Highways, with the consent of the said utility companies, the utilities plant be relocated, adjusted or abandoned, at the sole cost of the purchaser of the Surplus Highways, with such costs to be determined by the appropriate utility companies;
- (6) following closure of the Highways, the Highways for EDCT Jurisdictional Transfer be placed under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Highways to remain under WES Jurisdiction remain under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services;
- (7) the Surplus Highways be declared surplus to the City's requirements and all steps necessary to comply with Chapter 213 of the City of Toronto Municipal Code be taken;
- (8) the Commissioner of Corporate Services be authorized to invite an offer to purchase the portion of the Surplus Highways shown as Part 1 on Sketch No. PS-2003-045 from the adjoining property owners and to invite an offer to purchase the remainder of the Surplus Highways from the Owners referred to in the body of this report; and
- (9) the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto, including the introduction in Council of any bills necessary to give effect thereto.
- A. Councillor De Baeremaeker moved that the joint report (February 2, 2004) from the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services and the Commissioner of Corporate Services be approved subject to amending Recommendations Nos. (6), (7) and (8) to read as follows:

- "(6) following closure of the Highways, the Highways for EDCT Jurisdictional Transfer be placed under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism, and the Highways to remain under WES Jurisdiction, including Part 1 on Sketch PS-2003-045, remain under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services;

- (8) the Commissioner of Corporate Services be authorized to invite an offer to purchase the Surplus Highways more particularly described as Part 4 on Sketch PS-2003-048, Part 1 on Sketch PS-2003-049 and Parts 1, 3 and 7 on Sketch PS-2003-050 from the Owners referred to in the body of this report;".
