1. Snow Removal Practices in Bicycle Lanes (7:00 p.m. to 7:20 p.m.)

2. Toronto Bike Plan – Three-Year Implementation Strategy – Update and Bike Lane Approval Process (7:20 p.m. to 7:50 p.m.)
