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2005 Capital and Operating Budget

8.1 Toronto Zoo (Capital)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered the confidential report (December 2, 2004) from the Commissioner of Corporate Services respecting the proposed divestiture of the Valley Halla (Ward 42 Scarborough Rouge River), and because the subject matter may contain information on the security of the property of the municipality or local board under the Municipal Act, 2001, discussions be held in-camera.

The Budget Advisory Committee also had before it a confidential communication (December 15, 2004) from the City Clerk, advising that the Board of Management of the Toronto Zoo on December 15, 2004 considered the confidential report (December 2, 2004) from the Commissioner of Corporate Services.

Councillor Soknacki appointed Councillor Mihevc Acting Chair and vacated the Chair.

On motion by Councillor Soknacki, the Budget Advisory Committee:

- (1) reiterated its adoption of the 2005-2014 Capital Program for the Toronto Zoo, subject to amending such budget by reducing the funding for refurbishing Valley Halla to \$37,000;
- (2) requested City Council to direct the General Manager and CEO, Toronto Zoo, in consultation with appropriate City staff and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, to issue a "Request for Proposal" with regard to the Valley Halla; and
- (3) requested the General Manager and CEO of the Toronto Zoo, in consultation with appropriate City staff and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, upon City Council approval and following the receipt of the results of the Request for Proposal, to make recommendations to the Toronto Zoo Board with respect to the appropriate disposition of the Valley Halla; and
- (4) received the confidential communication.

Councillor Soknacki resumed the Chair.

8.2 Theatres (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered a briefing note, entitled "Capital Repair Envelope Responsibility for City Theatres".

On motion by Councillor Rae, the Budget Advisory Committee requested:

- (1) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism to work with the St. Lawrence Centre for the Performing Arts to develop a plan for the capital maintenance of the Centre and report thereon to the Economic Development and Parks Committee and the Budget Advisory Committee by July 2005;
- (2) the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer to develop a framework and policies for the treatment of minor and major capital projects for City Theatres which complies with City procedures and processes and report thereon to the Economic Development and Parks Committee and the Budget Advisory Committee by July 2005; and
- (3) the Hummingbird Centre and the Toronto Centre for the Arts, in consultation with the Chief Administrative Officer, the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer, to report on how they can improve efficiencies and achieve additional savings, including increased co-operation in areas such as programming and operations, and report thereon to the Budget Advisory Committee by July 2005.

8.3 Toronto Parking Authority (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered a communication (January 27, 2005) from the President, Toronto Parking Authority, responding to a request by the Budget Advisory Committee on January 24, 2005, for further information on options to increase its budgeted operating income for 2005 from \$42,066,300,00 (as submitted) to the 2004 budgeted level of \$43,012,200.00

On motion by Councillor Mihevc, the Budget Advisory Committee:

- (1) deferred consideration of the reinstatement of paid parking in parks in the amount of \$450.0 thousand gross and \$225.0 thousand net until its wrap up meeting on Monday January 31, 2005, to be considered with the Parks and Recreation Operating Budget; and
- (2) received the communication.

8.4 WES – Technical Services (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered the 2005 WES - Support Services Operating Budget.

On motion by Councillor Watson, the Budget Advisory Committee recommended to the Policy and Finance Committee, and Council, the adoption of the 2005 Operating Budget for WES - Technical Services, as recommended by the Works Committee, subject to the following amendments:

- (1) gapping be increased by \$600,000.00; and
- (2) the following adjustments to Inter-divisional Charges and Recoveries:
 - (a) decrease inter-divisional charges/recoveries to the Transportation Services Operating Budget by \$87,406.00;
 - (b) decrease inter-divisional charges/recoveries to the Transportation Services Capital Program by \$267,079.00;
 - (c) decrease inter-divisional recoveries for Toronto Water by \$245,515.00; and
 - (d) the Transportation and Toronto Water Capital and Operating Budgets be adjusted accordingly.

8.5 WES – Support Services (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered the 2005 WES - Technical Services Operating Budget.

On motion by Councillor Pitfield, the Budget Advisory Committee recommended to the Policy and Finance Committee, and Council, the adoption of the 2005 Operating Budget for WES – Support Services, as recommended by the Works Committee.

8.6 Transportation Services (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered outstanding issues in the 2005 Operating Budget for Transportation Services and Clean and Beautiful City issues.

A. Councillor Mihevc moved that the Budget Advisory Committee refer the issue of the 18 streets where there is 12-hour parking to the Works Committee for policy review and resolution, and further that the financial impact of \$24,500.00 be deferred until 2006 after completion of the policy review.

8.7 Toronto Public Health (Operating)

The Budget Advisory Committee considered outstanding issues in the 2005 Toronto Public Health Operating Budget.

A. Councillor Rae moved that the Budget Advisory Committee recommended to the Policy and Finance Committee, and Council, that the 2005 EMT Recommended Operating Budget for Toronto Public Health be further amended by the addition of \$56.6 thousand gross and \$25.5 thousand net for the Vaccine Preventable Disease Quality Assurance Program.

(Carried)

- B. Councillor Mihevc moved that:
 - (1) Councillor Rae's motion A. be amended by:
 - (a) increasing Dog Licence fees by \$10.00, to be implemented mid-year, for increased revenues of approximately \$70,000.00;
 - (b) deferring the additional services for Animal Field Services until 2006; and
