#### **Confirmation of Minutes**

## 10.1 Snow Removal Practices in Bicycle Lanes

Rob Orpin, Manager, Road Operations, Toronto and East York District, Transportation Services Division, presented a Power Point presentation regarding the procedure for winter maintenance in bicycle lanes.

# 10.2 Toronto Bike Plan – Three-Year Implementation Strategy – Update and Bike Lane Approval Process

The Toronto Cycling Committee had before it a communication (September 14, 2005) from the City Clerk, advising that the Works Committee on September 14, 2005, considered the attached report ((August 25, 2005) from Deputy City Manager Fareed Amin, providing a proposed strategy for accelerating the Toronto Bike Plan, particularly the implementation of the Bikeway Network by Transportation Services, for consideration as part of the 2006 budget review process; reporting out the decisions made by the Works Committee; and containing the following motion:

"WHEREAS the slow approval process for bike lanes has been identified as a serious

hindrance to implementation of the Bikeway Network;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Transportation Services prepare a report, in consultation with the Toronto Cycling Committee, for the November 16, 2005, meeting of the Works Committee on options for an expedited bike lane approval process for both road reconstruction and retrofitting."

The Toronto Cycling Committee also had before it a communication (October 11, 2005) from Martin Koob, Member, Toronto Cycling Committee, forwarding proposed recommendations regarding the bike lane approval process.

- (2) the Chair and Co-Chairs forward a draft of the response via e-mail to Toronto Cycling Committee members for their review and input prior to submitting the response.
