### **Confirmation of Minutes**

### 11.1 Bicycle User Group Network (BUGS) Video

The Bicycle Promotions Coordinator, Transportation Planning, City Planning Division presented the DVD Video entitled "Bicycle User Group Network (BUGS) – Tips for Commuting". The BUGS video is the first-ever commuting tips video produced especially for BUG Network members in Toronto is designed for new riders and provides information on how to be a commuting cyclist.

  - (a) request the General Manager, Transportation Services Division, to report on:
    - (i) the addition of a separate road classification for streets with a bike lane and streets with a signed bicycle route in the Transportation Services "Guidelines for Initiation and Completion of Snow Removal", giving a higher level of service than is currently employed on these types of streets; and
    - (ii) the feasibility of removing cars parked in bike lanes during snow emergencies to allow for snow clearing;
  - (b) conduct periodic checks on the clearing of bike lanes to at least one metre as outlined in the Winter Services Operations document and report on the results to the Toronto Cycling Committee; and
  - (c) explore the feasibility of night-time clearance of snow in parking laybys on streets with bike lanes (e.g. St. George Street, College Street) including the option of using smaller vehicles with sharper turning ability; and

(d) request Toronto Public Health/Board of Health to investigate options for enhancing bike priority as a public health protection measure on smog alert days, including comment on possible bike priority measures on Bloor Street, as a component of the September 14, 2005 Works Committee approval of a communication to Works Committee on the "Tooker Gomberg Memorial Bike Lane".

  - (c) Sidewalk cut-outs for pull-ins at all bike parking locations;
  - (d) Adequate space for motorists to pull over and let out passengers without obstructing a bike lane or route;
  - (e) Bike station facility be provided (bike rental, repair, attended parking, etc.);
  - (f) Options for both short and long term bicycle parking for customers and employees at Union Station;
  - (g) Bike Lockers be provided for cyclists at the Station and in the precinct area;
  - (h) Ramps or "bicycle channels" on stairs surrounding / within station to improve access to station and railway platforms;

- (i) Bikeshare Hub at Union station or close to the station in the precinct area; and
- (j) Bike route connecting Mill Street to the Esplanade and to Union Station.

## 11.9 Request to Develop Alternative Standards for the Width of a Bike Lane

The Planning and Transportation Committee requested the Toronto Cycling Committee to develop alternative standards for the width of a bike lane that reflects the need to make adjustments to accommodate speed limits, narrower roads and competing uses in order to be able to extend the bike lane plan of the City on a more comprehensive basis; and

(2) report (September 26, 2005) from the General Manager, Transportation Services Division, responding the various requests by City Council, North York Community Council and Works Committee on design options for bicycle lanes and signed bicycle routes.
