The Planning and Transportation Committee requested the Toronto Cycling Committee to develop alternative standards for the width of a bike lane that reflects the need to make adjustments to accommodate speed limits, narrower roads and competing uses in order to be able to extend the bike lane plan of the City on a more comprehensive basis.
