1. Contract 07SC-07WP, Tender Call 144-2007 - Massey Creek Retaining Wall Rehabilitation and Bank Stabilization - Scarborough District

Action taken by the Committee

The Bid Committee adopted the staff recommendation in the Recommendation Section of the report (June 12, 2007) from the Executive Director, Technical Services, and the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management.

Report (June 12, 2007) from the Executive Director, Technical Services, and the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management, advising on the results of Tender Call 144-2007 issued for the Massey Creek Retaining Wall Rehabilitation and Bank Stabilization, Scarborough District, in accordance with specifications as required by Technical Services, and requesting the authority to award a contract to the recommended bidder.

Recommendation:

The Executive Director of Technical Services and the Director of Purchasing and Materials Management recommend that authority be granted to award Contract 07SC-07WP, Tender Call 144-2007, for the, Massey Creek Retaining Wall Rehabilitation and Bank Stabilization, Scarborough District to Anscon Contracting Inc., in the amount of \$1,567,844.54, net of GST, having submitted the lowest bid.

2. Request for Proposal 9119-07-7157 - Provision of Professional Services to Provide Energy and Water Efficiency Improvements in 21 Toronto Police Facilities (All Wards)

Action taken by the Committee

The Bid Committee adopted the staff recommendation in the Recommendation Section of the report (June 15, 2007) from the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management.

Report (June 15, 2007) from the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management, advising on the results of the Request for Proposal 9119-07-7157 for the provision of professional services to provide energy and water efficiency improvements in 21 Toronto Police Facilities, and requesting authority to negotiate and enter into a water and energy services agreement with the recommended Proponent.

Recommendation:

Recommendation:

The Executive Director of Technical Services and the Director of Purchasing and Materials Management recommend that authority be granted to award Contract 07FS-49WP, Tender Call 136-2007, for the Highland Creek Treatment Plant -Replacement of Aeration System in Tank No. 12 to W. A. Stephenson Mechanical Contractors Limited, in the total amount of \$752,830.19 net of GST, having submitted the lowest bid meeting specifications.

Recommendation:

The 3-1-1 Executive Sponsor Deputy City Manager and the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management recommend that authority be granted to enter into an agreement satisfactory to the 3-1-1 Project Director and the City Solicitor with CTI Working Environments, having submitted the highest scoring Proposal, in the amount of \$862,860.98 net of GST, including provisional items, disbursements, and contingencies of \$60,000.00 for additional services if necessary and authorized by the 3-1-1 Project Director.
