Minutes Confirmed -

Meeting of October 15, 2007 of the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee

1. Election of Two Co-Chairs (7:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.)

Decision Advice and Other Information:

The Chair called for nominations.

Mr. Fred Sztabinski and Ms. Paulette Blais, were nominated for the position of Co-Chair.

There being no further nominations, Mr. Fred Sztabinski and Ms. Paulette Blais, were both acclaimed for the position of Co-Chair for the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee.

The Committee Secretary will assume the Chair for the purpose of conducting the election for the two Co-Chair positions for the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee.

2. Martin Goodman Trail Bollards at the Boulevard Club (7:10 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.)

Action taken by the Committee:

The Committee requested the Public Works and Infrastructure Committee to request the General Manager, Transportation Services, in consultation with the General Manager, Parks, Forestry and Recreation, to report on:

- 1. the removal of the second row of bollards and review alternative bollard configuration on the Martin Goodman Trail at the Boulevard Club;
- 2. possible traffic flow improvements in and around the entrance to the Boulevard Club, including the feasibility of restricting left turn in and left turn out to/from the Boulevard Club to Lakeshore Boulevard West; and
- 3. the development of a policy and standards regarding the installation of bollards in the City of Toronto.

Request to review the issues that cyclists have been complaining about since the bollards at the Boulevard Club were installed in the summer, 2007, and requesting the Committee to hear the concerns of cyclists and the opinion of City staff, and perhaps provide a recommendation.

The Supervisor, Parks, PFR Parks Toronto/East York Area 7, Parks, Forestry and Recreation, will provide a verbal update regarding the Martin Goodman Trail Bollards at the Boulevard Club.

3. Waterfront Toronto – Request for Representative on The Martin Goodman Trail at Ontario Place (7:30 p.m. to 7:40 p.m.)

Action taken by the Committee:

The Committee recommended that:

1. Ms. Margaret Hastings-James and Mr. Fred Sztabinski, be appointed as the representatives from the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee to the Waterfront Toronto – The Martin Goodman Trail at Ontario Place project; that they coordinate their attendance to any future meetings that are held; and that they report back to Committee from time-to-time, as they may deem appropriate.

Mr. Donald Weidman will make a 10-minute presentation on the GO-by-Bike pilot project; creating a healthier community and environment by connecting active living, tourism and commuter cycling with rail, subway and bus services.

9. Toronto Bike Plan Progress Report and Presentation on Sharrow Pavement Markings

Decision Advice and Other Information:

The Chair advised that discussions have been held with all Members of Council and City staff to reach the goal of installing 50 kilometres of new Bike Lanes in 2008, and that a report will be presented to the Executive Committee on January 8, 2008 on a streamlined bicycle lane approval process.

The Manager, Pedestrian and Cycling Infrastructure, will present an update on the progress of the Toronto Bike Plan, following the Bike Plan Consultation Session held on July 23, 2007, and make a presentation on Sharrow pavement markings.

The Manager, Pedestrian and Cycling Infrastructure, Transportation Services, will provide a Glossary on various cycling terminology at the commencement of his presentation.
