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# Council Member Appointments to Executive, Standing and Special Committees and Major City Agencies

#### **City Council Decision**

City Council on December 5 and 6, 2006, adopted the following motions:

- 1. Council appoint Members to the Executive, standing and special committees and major City agencies as listed in the attached Lists 1 and 2.
- 2. The term of these appointments be until December 31, 2008 and until successors are appointed, under Municipal Code Chapter 27, unless the List notes otherwise.
- 3. Councillor-elect Fletcher's appointments take effect when she has made her declaration of office.
- 4. Council authorize and direct the City Solicitor to introduce the bills needed to make appointments to the Toronto Transit Commission and any other City board.
- 5. The City Clerk notify Members and the committees and agencies of the appointments.

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#### 2007 Proposed Schedule of Meetings

#### **City Council Decision**

City Council on December 5 and 6, 2006, adopted the following motions:

- 1. City Council approve the **revised** 2007 meeting schedule dates for January to December 2007 (Attachment 1), and the published schedule serve as notice for these meetings.
- 2. City Council approve the following new meeting times for committee and Council meetings to permit enough time to complete agenda business:
  - a. 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.;
  - b. 1:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.; and
  - c. 7:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. (meetings must finish on Fridays before sundown).
- 3. The City Clerk distribute the approved schedule to the City's agencies and special purpose bodies with a request that they:
  - a. avoid scheduling meetings, whenever possible, that conflict with the approved schedule; and
  - b. avoid scheduling public meetings, forums, public consultations and large-scale meetings on days of cultural or religious significance as noted in the approved schedule.
- 4. The City Clerk review the practice of Council meetings starting on a Monday and the new meeting times for committees and Council meetings, after six months, and report to the Striking Committee.
- 5. The City Clerk ensure that no meetings are scheduled after 12:00 noon on Friday, September 21, 2007, instead of sundown, for Yom Kippur.

#### Pre-Approval of 2007 Capital Projects - Commitment and Spending

#### **City Council Decision**

City Council on December 5 and 6, 2006, adopted the following motions:

- 1. Council approval be granted to enter into commitments on New and Change in Scope projects/sub-projects totalling \$299.430 million gross during the period January 1 to March 31, 2007, comprised of the following:
  - a. \$279.074 million gross with debt financing of \$152.571 million for Tax Supported Programs; and
  - b. \$20.356 million gross for Rate Supported Programs.
- 2. Council authorize spending (cash flow) during the period January 1 to March 31, 2007, totalling \$402.260 million comprised of the following:
  - a. New and Change in Scope projects/subprojects totalling \$35.477 million with debt financing of \$14.358 million;
  - b. Previously Approved projects/sub-projects totalling \$244.277 million gross with debt financing of \$95.361 million; and
  - c. Carry forward of 2006 projects/subprojects totalling \$122.506 million with no incremental impact on debt.
- 3. Debenture financing not to exceed \$109.719 million (for New and Change in Scope, and Previously Approved Projects) with a term not exceeding the lesser of 10 years or the useful life of the capital assets, be approved.
- 4. City Council authorize other financing sources for New and Change in Scope and Previously Approved Projects as follows: Reserves/Reserve Funds in the amount of \$114.783 million, Development Charges in the amount of \$5.162 million and other financing source in the amount of \$124.377 million.

- 5. The Deputy City Manager responsible for Solid Waste Management Services report to the appropriate successor Committee dealing with these matters prior to awarding any contract for the project of Recycling Containers, on the result of the RFP and the financial implications of implementing this project. This will allow for a more accurate assessment of the debt impact this project would have on Solid Waste Management Services' 5-year Capital Plan.
- 6. The appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

# Regulation of Holiday Shopping upon Proclamation of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*

#### **City Council Decision**

City Council on December 5 and 6, 2006, adopted the following motions:

- 1. The City Solicitor be authorized to introduce a bill regulating holiday shopping on the eight days a year currently regulated by the *Retail Business Holidays Act* in substantially the same manner as is currently provided for in the *Retail Business Holidays Act* and maintaining the "tourist area" exemptions that have been previously approved by Council.
- 2. The General Manager of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism undertake a consultative process seeking input from the general public, retail industry, retail sector employees, small business interests, BIAs and the tourism industry with respect to policy options on the regulation of holiday shopping and report back to the Economic Development Committee by December 31, 2007 recommending a new regulatory framework governing holiday shopping.
