1. Update – Centennial Park Master Plan (7:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.)

The Committee at its meeting on January 21, 2008:

- 1. requested the Manager, Pedestrian and Cycling Infrastructure, Transportation Services Division, in consultation with appropriate City staff, to report to the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee at its next meeting on March 17, 2008, on:
 - a. the ownership of the private road, as identified in the presentation from Planning staff of Parks, Forestry and Recreation; and
 - b. the proposed time line to install bike lanes on the private road; and
- 2. requested the Planner, Planning Design and Development, Parks, Forestry and Recreation, to report to the Toronto Cycling Advisory Committee at its next meeting on March 17, 2008 on the proposed bike loop around the ski hill at Centennial Park.

TCAC program staff will provide a verbal update.

2. Great Waterfront Trail Adventure (Presentation - 7:10 p.m. to 7:25 p.m.)
